

THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE

FFFI ING AT HOME

here do you feel at home? It might be the house or flat you now live in? Or maybe a place from childhood? Perhaps there's a seat on the football terrace or at the

theatre that's home for you, or it's being down the local pub or at the club or the friends house? Or maybe nowhere quite feels like home.

It strikes me that the feeling of being 'home', of being content and feeling safe and secure is something that is becoming increasingly fleeting. We are often sold on the need to move on to the next thing, the new place, job, relationship or challenge.



Maybe we can't feel the peace of 'home' if the kitchen's not clean or the family aren't present (or are present!). Our lives are meant to be better that this, somehow, aren't they? And so that sensation of being at home and being settled gets lost. When was the last time you knew the peace of home?

Over these last few months, with the arrival of our latest child Matthew, I have needed to take some time off for various reasons. Being encouraged to just spend time at home, I recognised that my home life was not something I particularly cherished. For example, I used to try and rush through my children's bedtime. If I could get it done then I could maybe relax, get some work done or watch what I wanted on TV. I was always onto the next thing. However, with a newborn the next thing I wanted to do never seemed to come. I was left frustrated, a little bitter perhaps and certainly exhausted. If I could have chosen being at home or the pub – well it wouldn't have been a difficult choice.

Noticing this frustration and realising it was helping no one, I decided to try and just enjoy the kids' bedtime, however long it took. Now watching my children drift off to sleep is a highlight of the day. Not so that I can get on, but rather because there's just beauty in that moment.

Granted, children falling asleep is a bit of a miracle, but I've realised that the same is true of many of the simple things in life. I know plenty of you for whom gardening makes you feel at home, or cooking, or chatting to your family. I'd like to encourage you, even as I encourage myself, to try and enjoy some other part of being at home too.

There is a verse at the beginning of John's gospel which talks about 'the Word of God making his dwelling [or home] among us.' (1:14) John's story about Jesus continues with Jesus declaring that wherever we are, he is still in the business of making his home with us (John 14:23).

When we take the time to enjoy being at home, can we stop striving for a moment and become aware of the peace, beauty, creativity, generosity and love that is around us. Maybe, if we do, we are beginning to glimpse the shimmers of divine love or hear the echo of that divine promise. God making his home with us.

Since the leaving of Eden, God has been calling his prodigal sons and daughters home, and making his dwelling with them. It is my prayer that you may know more of his peace and presence in your home this month.



USEFUL ADVICE FROM RBWM TRADING STANDARDS

HOME REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

t's cold and wet outside and we're all huddled up inside. What could be more worrying than somebody cold calling you in person or on the phone to say that your home may not be as cosy or protected as you thought? Here are some of the current issues:



- Moss on the roof although considered by some to be unsightly it is not generally detrimental to the roof. Consumers should not have their roofs jet washed as it will damage the surface of the roof tile and reduce its lifespan. Walking on the tiles while jet washing can also lead to damage. Cold callers will often extol the virtues of sealant for the roof, these claims are at best exaggerated and at worst completely false.
- **Spray foam insulation** Consumers are warned to be very careful if approached to have this sort of insulation sprayed onto the roof timbers. If you already have conventional loft insulation the foam can have a negligible effect on heat loss. It can also increase the risk of trapped moisture leading to rot and decay. Also some mortgage lenders will not lend on properties which have this insulation.
- **Solar Panels** some people are being approached with an offer of a "free solar health check" once on site they offer unnecessary add-on sales after the so-called 'free check' has been carried out. By involving a third party you may also void any guarantee or warranty from the original company.

What can you do:

- Never agree to have any work done by someone who has knocked on your door/cold called on the phone.
- **Don't** be rushed into making a decision on work. Don't sign any waiver for work to be started immediately. Take your 14-day cooling

off period to think about the deal and speak with friends and family.

- If you think you need any work get a few quotes and use a trader from an approved scheme *Buy with Confidence / Trustmark* which have a dispute resolution schemes.
- Report suspicious activity to the Police on 101 or 999 in an emergency. You can also report to Trading Standards via 03454 040506.

IT'S FEBRUARY, SO PANCAKES AND ROSES, AND IT'S A LEAP YEAR!

The intention is that the woman can wear the gloves to hide the embarrassment of not having an engagement ring. During the middle ages there were laws governing this





tradition. Which leads me nicely on to Valentine's Day on the 14th. Do people still use this as an opportunity to send a loved-from-afar one a card or a flower anonymously? 

A CALL TO ACTION - WE HAVE A PLANET TO SAVE!

ne of the outstanding features of 2019 was 'the clarion call' to address global climate change. We saw many natural disasters, with unprecedented flooding and bushfires dominating the news bulletins at Christmas.

Dr Steven Croft, Bishop of Oxford, described the climate catastrophe as "the greatest crisis of the age; the time to act is now." He called for us to "make the adjustment to our Church and individual lives" and to "take a daily decision to focus on climate action." Pope Francis: "civilisation requires energy, but energy use must not destroy civilisation" (*Church Times*, 21 June 2019).

What are the implications for Christians and for all people who care about our Earth? Is this responsibility for our planet something that we can leave to our governments to do? The lack of consensus at the Madrid COP 25 talks and no implementation plan yet for the UK does not inspire confidence.

The Revd John Weaver (2007) suggests that although Psalm 115 states "The Earth is the Lord's, he has given it to us", it is only on leasehold, to rule on God's behalf (Genesis 1: 26, 28). Genesis 2:15 states "We are stewards of God's world". But we have not followed the Maker's instructions!

For a Christian life we cannot simply have dominion over the Earth and plunder resources. We have a responsibility to be ethical stewards, caring for the Earth, sharing resources with the poor and exercising restraint

"We do not inherit the earth from our ancestors but borrow it from our children" (Native American proverb). Fortunately, we have a chance to limit the damage – if we act now

The Swedish schoolgirl activist, Greta Thunberg, urged world leaders to act immediately, before it is too late. Her film with George Monbiot highlights the need to use nature itself to tackle the climate crisis. Living ecosystems like forests, mangroves, swamps and seabeds can pull enormous quantities of carbon from the air and store them safely, see https://youtu.be/-Q0xUXo2zEY.

The Take Home message: don't cut down your trees and plants! Plant more trees and reduce the use of pesticides and artificial fertilisers.

Although we may not be able to change the world, we can all change our own backyard. At St Michael's and All Souls churches we are doing simple things like replacing conventional light bulbs with LEDs, recycling paper, reducing single-use plastics and reducing waste. We are starting to look at the use of our buildings, our land and energy consumption.

Small things. But each one of us CAN make a difference. And the more of us that do, the bigger that difference will be. So how would it be if each of us did 'Just One Small Thing' differently? For example, sometimes walking, cycling or using public transport instead of the car;

buying locally sourced feeds from farmers' markets or growing our own; avoiding excessive packaging; cutting down on single-use plastics, re-using bags for shopping. That piece of clingfilm may be around in 1,000 years' time. But we may not. Dust off some vegan and veggie recipes.

Take time to get informed and research solutions. Google topics such as: personal-climate-change action (further websites listed below).

Anyway, I hope that gets you started! Let's see if we can each try 'Just One Small Thing' to collectively make a difference in 2020. Happy New Year!

REVIEW SLEEPING BEAUTY

QUINCE PLAYERS, CORDES HALL, SUNNINGHILL 9th-12th AND 15th-18th JANUARY 2020

et's do the Time Warp Again... Sorry, wrong show, but we all finished the evening at the Cordes Hall by standing in our seats and doing the Time Warp. Well, we had

just slept for a hundred years! I'm pleased to say though, that the audience were very much awake and joining in with clapping, hissing, booing, laughing and hes'behindvouing at the Ouince Players' annual pantomime. This year it's Sleeping Beauty directed by Andrew Darling with some panache, I have to say. The cast of thousands all knew what they were doing, and I went on only the second night and didn't spot any slip-ups. The jokes were corny (we love corny jokes!) but laugh out loud mostly and I loved the dialogue between Fetch (Simon Hurry) and Carrie (Jenny Faulkner-Hooper) who guickly went through a list of about 30 or 40 British towns and bringing them into their discussion with such lines as "the cows didn't want their 'uddersfield" Get it? Jokes such as Nurse Hettie Harpic (Quiller Rees) trying to resuscitate the newly sleeping Beauty –

Princess Rose (Sadie Nuttall) to the strains of "Stayin' Alive", the iconic Bee Gees song. Fortunately Prince Alexis eventually turned up in the guise of his great grandson Prince Alexander, wittily and spiritedly played by newcomer Charlie Stokes, and saved the day by cutting his way boldly through the beautifully choreographed trees and brambles. Belle Whitbread was suitably twinkly as good fairy Lilac and although she exuded goodandkindness, there was a determination in her style, so you felt almost sorry for the bad Witch Hazel, exquisitely

personified by Fiona Barker, who couldn't quite get her "spell"ing write in the long run, but gave us several nail biting moments. Allison Sharpe and David Barker were suitably regal as King

Cactus and Queen Marigold, so regal in fact that maybe they could take over from Harry and Meghan! Lots of songs and dancing from a well-trained and good-looking chorus, and I was impressed by Sadie's singing voice. and hope to hear more of that in future productions. A novel device in this production was the three "Quincerley" Sisters who came to sing in front of a 1940s microphone right at the start and from time to time. The FAB three were Florence Hooper. Amelie Barker and Becky Dore. That was a nice touch to the proceedings, and again some pitch perfect singing voices.
