

THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Revd Sarah Mortimer joined the team in the parish in July 2020 and this month the minister's message comes from her.



ow do you feel about jigsaw puzzles? Is it a top favourite pastime, or to be avoided at all costs? What kind of image would you choose to piece together? We've had a cityscape on the go with lots of blue sky and framed by golden autumn leaves in the foreground. No prizes for identifying which city!

End of year purchasing analysis showed that jigsaw

puzzle sales soared during 2020. It's just one small sign of the dramatic changes there have been in our activities and patterns of life over the last year. And we adapted as best we could, sometimes gracefully, sometimes grudgingly, sometimes agonisingly, but always with that sense of being in this together.

We understood the need for our personal choices to be for the greater good of

everyone; that we were connected. Just as each piece of the jigsaw has to be attached in the right place for the picture to be right, we have each needed to do our bit. You might be one of the vast number of plain blue pieces that make up the sky, part of the essential backdrop of people simply adhering to government guidelines to prevent the spread of the virus. Or are you one of the golden bits? The autumn leaves in the foreground, a key worker on the frontline?

But of course no two pieces of jigsaw are actually interchangeable: when you look closely even those blue pieces that form the huge tranche of sky have distinctive features. No one can replace us; we are unique – the only perfect fit for the role of being ourselves in this community.

The need to contribute to the big picture continues in 2021 as we seek to be part of piecing together a landscape where COVID is controlled and no longer wreaking havoc. Where can our resource come from to keep on keeping on? Jesus paints the evocative picture of himself as the vine and us as branches, able to show love and be fruitful in our lives as we stay connected to Jesus' love (John 15). And the early Christian leader Paul used the image of an olive tree to explain how branches can be grafted in for a first time or regrafted in to connect or reconnect to the nourishing root of the tree (Romans 11).

The Christian season of Lent begins on 17th February and is traditionally a reflective time. Let's take it as an opportunity to connect, reconnect or strengthen our connection with God. And let's do it together: in our families, with our friends and in our church. Our website will have the latest information about how you can join in. Your contribution to a shared conversation about faith might just be the missing piece in someone else's faith jigsaw.

This latest lockdown has meant more change for everyone. The Government has asked us to stay at home to save lives and protect the NHS. Under the current regulations public worship may continue. POETRY INTO THE NEW YEAR

A s I write, January has just begun and if the weather forecast is accurate it will be a long cold month. So, let's think about 'love' and St Valentine's Day with romantic verse to suit the occasion, beginning with perhaps one of the most beautifully written poems about love written by Christopher Marlowe. The Passionate Shepherd To His Love begins,

Come live with me and be my love, And we will all the pleasures prove." And goes on to describe all the wonderful things he will bestow on his lover ending; "If these delights thy mind may move, Then live with me and be my love.

Hinterhof, a poem by an English modern poet James Fenton begins,

Stay near to me, and I'll stay near to you -As near as you are dear to me will do. Near as the rainbow to the rain, The west wind to the window pane, As fire to hearth, as dawn to dew.

Perhaps an unusual choice, but still romantic in its way, **The Owl and the Pussy Cat** by Edward Lear, an unlikely pairing but you cannot deny the romance in the poem:

O lovely Pussy, O Pussy my love, What a beautiful Pussy you are!

One poet of whom it could be said should be able to write romantic verse is Robert Burns. Well known as a 'ladies man', one of

his best known poems, **My Luve is Like a Red, Red Rose** includes the lines,

As fair thou art my Bonnie Lass, So deep in love am I, And I will love thee, still my dear, Till a' the seas gang dry.

Elizabeth Barrett Browning was a poet of the Victorian Romantic movement and wrote:

How do I love thee let me count the ways, I love thee to the depth and breadth and height my soul can reach.

Adrian Henri, one of the Liverpool poets of the 1960s, with Brian Patten and Roger McGough, wrote **Love Is**, a slightly risqué poem which ends,

> Love is you, love is me, Love is a prison and love is free, Love's what's there when you are away from me, Love Is.

However, as Shakespeare wrote, 'the course of true love never did run smooth' so to finish, an amusing few lines by Wendy Cope, **Loss**:

The day he moved out was terrible, That evening she went through hell, His absence wasn't a problem, But the corkscrew had gone as well!

Happy Valentine's Day, all you romantics!

COMMUNITY LITTER PICKING

In 2020 the value of public greenspaces, as a haven for exercise and relaxation, could not have been more recognized. However, sadly this recognition has gone hand in hand with a large increase in left litter. Sunninghill and Ascot Parish Council has been operating a volunteer litter picking scheme since the start of November 2020 to keep our parish looking its best. Volunteers and Parish Councilors regularly cover the main parks and streets of South Ascot and Sunninghill up to Ascot High Street. Working together we aim for a litter free Parish but there is a long way to go. According to the results of Keep Britain Tidy's national survey of the state of England's streets, litter has increased since the survey was last carried out in 2014/15.The most commonly littered item is cigarette butts, found on 79% of sites surveyed. The following three most littered items are confectionery packs (found on

60% of sites), soft drink bottles and cans (52%) and fast food related litter (33%). This pattern of "on the go" related litter is reflected in the rubbish bags of our volunteers but we can effect change. Clearing our green spaces of litter and improving the appearance of our Parish is an effective way to generate pride in our local area. This appreciation of litter free places can bring about the shift in behaviour needed to stop littering happening in the first place. To create the clean parks, woods and streets we all want to see, picking up litter is an important small step. ello, my name is Bernice and I'm a practising midwife of 20 years and now a personal trainer and Pilates teacher specialising in women's health. I set up my own local company 2 years ago and run a variety of classes for women of all ages, from pregnancy until menopause!

During the initial lockdown last year, I set up a Bracknell Bumps aroup, working with Home-start Bracknell Forest, Home-start is a charity that supports ordinary parents in extraordinary times, and I think we can all agree that this has been an extraordinary year! This group has supported so many mums and became a lifeline for some. It helped them connect and it's been lovely to hear that they are now managing to meet face to face as well as continuing online. We expanded the group to include the mums with their babies as we wanted to stay connected and we still meet weekly. As a midwife I know how important these connections are and I am keen to expand this to help reach expectant mums in Ascot and the surrounding areas.

Are we living in lockdown, had a lightening strike, furloughed, home working or caught in a spike. Hands, face, space, the current song but in which Tier do you belong.


Schools open, schools close; some in and some out no exams if you're Welsh, is that a fair shout. Are we not all key workers when put to the test Check and trace us is surely the best.


CHEAPSIDE C of E PRIMARY SCHOOL

unninghill Radio is a local online radio station set up during the first lockdown by local Year 11 resident, Jackson Sanders. Broadcasting online every Saturday from 12pm to 11pm, and there is a schedule of six or seven varied weekly shows presented by other locals - including friends and family. The programmes feature great music from the 60s to current day and also include a current and local affairs phone in show, Tracking Back where a different quest each week chooses five tunes which take the listener through their life, Jazz Dance, a Saturday evening show focusing on jazz from around the world, decade specials on the 60s, 70s and 80s, great chat, guizzes and more.

Jackson explains that a couple of months into the first lockdown. he was beginning to put together radio show recordings for friends and family he couldn't see and had the time to look into it further and set the station up: "I've always wanted to be a radio presenter because of my love of music and presenting and lockdown gave me the perfect opportunity to do this. There were not many opportunities available - particularly at my age - and so setting something up was the best option."

It has not all been plain sailing though! Jackson has struggled with technical bugs, poorly presenters and failing software – as well as learning how to manage volunteers, get to grips with music licensing and ensuring the shows go on each week, but he admits that "it is very rewarding presenting my shows, producing shows for others, listening to the radio and hearing feedback from people who have enjoyed the station."

Having ironed out most of the technical gremlins and with some new local volunteer presenters due to start broadcasting shortly, Sunninghill Radio is now looking to help raise awareness of local issues – while maintaining its overall focus on great music! There are lots of ways to get involved from calling in on issues, requesting a track, taking part in a quiz, to helping out with the running of the station. 

GAMBIA UPDATE

A nupdate on our fundraising for The Gambia and the schools our churches support. We had a very successful Quiz with amazing questions set by Pami Cross. It was won by Peter and Sheila Brown who scored 39.5 out of 50, well done all. It raised over £1,000 and we sent some of the money immediately so that they got it before Christmas.

This enabled the schools to be in session as many of the children's families are now unable to pay the fees. They were able to pay the salaries of the teachers so they didn't lose them. It helped to purchase sanitizers, bleach and tissues to keep staff and pupils as safe as possible.

All three schools still have urgent needs so our fundraising must continue, The Gambia has seen a resurgence of COVID cases over the last week, four times as many cases! Entry requirements to the country are a negative test within 72 hours before arrival to the country and travellers will have to pay to stay in a facility awaiting another negative result. this will have a negative impact on vital tourism and inevitably result in more poverty. George Memorial School in Serrekunda need money for registration fees for the West African Examination Boards of Grade 9 and 12.


