

# THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE FINAL WORDS...

his is my final magazine edition as Vicar of this parish. That feels very strange to write, just as strange as moving on from the area that has meant so much to me and us as a family. I started as Vicar here, aged 29 (and looking younger I'm told) and leave in my 40s with a beard, three children and lots of precious memories.

I've written a separate 'thank you for the memories' piece on page 11 because in this message I wanted to share something precious with you (one last time). In Matthew's gospel we read of Jesus saying:

The kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it. (Mt 13:45-46)

When Jesus speaks of the Kingdom of heaven, he is talking about finding life as it is meant to be, of encountering the King and sharing the adventure of faith with Him. Churches and vicars, like all of us, can often get consumed by significant internal matters like roof repairs, music for services, well I'm sure you can imagine more, and forget that it's really all about this fine, precious pearl.

It is all too easy to miss the point of life. The merchant of this parable had acquired significant wealth. He'd most probably prioritised getting a good job; working all hours; earning financial and society success but then he spots the pearl of great price, and he knows he must

stop at nothing to get it. He sells it all, riches to rags, for the sake of the Kingdom of heaven and life with the King.

I'm guessing that all of us have, at one time or another, caught a glimpse of this pearl. Even during the anxiety of 'lockdown' there have been moments of serene peace or extravagant joy where we've realised life could (perhaps should) be different. This parable encourages us to seek that out, more and more. Not to give in to a life of stress – searching for significance and meaning in all the wrong places – but to pursue the Kingdom, and pursue the King.



'Repent for the Kingdom of heaven is close at hand,' Jesus says earlier in Matthew's gospel, in fact it is his first ever sermon (Mt 4:17). Jesus urges us to turn away from everything that would stop us seeking this pearl. It's so close, he says, if you just switch of the TV for a moment or take a minute in prayer; if you say sorry for the hurt you're causing or have caused and ask for forgiveness and God's deep peace; if you dive into the story of the Jesus and hear of his great love for you.

I hope that over the years, maybe through these messages or a church service, a school assembly, deed or word of hope, I've been able to help you glimpse this precious pearl. I know I've not got everything right and if, along the way I've hurt you or let you down, I'm truly sorry.

As I sign off though, can I ask you please to start praying now for the man or woman who will become the new vicar of Sunninghill and South Ascot (there are exciting times ahead), and to never stop seeking out the new, precious, hopeful life of God's Kingdom.

In love, prayer and the name of Jesus, may God bless you all.

# IT'S FUN TO PRAY

his year St Michael's and All Souls' churches took part in a global wave of prayer 'Thy Kingdom Come'. These words form part of the prayer that Jesus taught his disciples, the Lord's Prayer. This prayer initiative invites us to pray between the Christian festivals of Ascension and Pentecost.

We began with an open air Ascension service at 6am followed by Bucks Fizz (or coffee) and croissants and ended with a 24 hour chain of prayer with around 60 people signing up to pray for their chosen 30 minutes wherever they were - home, garden, park, at the outdoor prayer stations at each of our churches or even on the 10km youth pilgrimage across Windsor Great Park. It highlighted how worship and prayer can take place in all kinds of creative ways and bring hope and joy that can transform our perspectives when times are tough as well as when the road is easy. Conversation with God is essentially what prayer is, so keep praying and look out more special prayer events in the future.

ASCENSION SERVICE



In the death-throes of the Third Reich, appalling war crimes were committed the innocent. In six gripping accounts, the author, a long-standing investigative writer, demonstrated that the SS were not solely responsible. # **POETRY CORNER**

Whith school holidays approaching soon, poems this month for the young and young at heart. Throughout the 1800s which is when poetry really began to be written specifically for children, the poems were very often of a precautionary, scary, almost threatening nature, or slanted towards good behaviour, good deeds and the repercussions that could befall an errant child. The poems were written not necessarily for fun or enjoyment but rather for instruction or discipline.

A ray of light in the gloom was Robert Louis Stevenson. He was born in 1850, and suffered throughout his life with respiratory problems, and from an early age was confined to his bed, where he developed an amazing imagination. His lumpy bed and bed clothes became waves or mountains and he used characters he saw from his window, ed., Leerie the lamplighter.

Growing up, my favourite Stevenson poem was From a Railway Carriage.

Faster than fairies, faster than witches, Bridges and houses, hedges and ditches, And charging along like troops in a battle, All through the meadows the horses and cattle, All of the sights of the hill and the plain, Fly as thick as driving rain. And ever again in the wink of an eye, Painted stations whistle by.

Try to read it in the rhythm of a train, a steam train obviously! Many of his poems were short, presumably to hold a child's interest.

#### Time to Rise

A birdie with a yellow bill, Hopped upon the windowsill, Cocked his shining eye and said, Ain't you shamed you sleepy head.

#### Or **Happy Thought**

The world is full of a number of things, I'm sure we should all be as happy as Kings.

His poems were always rhythmic and rhymed. Apart from his children's verse Stevenson also wrote *Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde, Kidnapped* and *Treasure Island.* 

He died in Samoa at the age of 44, where he had gone to improve his health. He is also remembered for *Requiem* which ends:

Coming up to date, Spike Milligan also wrote rhyming, rhythmic simple poetry. One of his best-known poems is *On the Ning Nang Nong*.

On the Ning, Nang Nong
Where the cows go bong,
And the monkeys all say Boo,
There's a Nong, Nang, Ning,
Where the trees go ping,
And the teapots jibber, jabber too.....
And ends
What a noisy place to belong,
Is the Ning, Nang, Nang, Nang, Nong!

#### And The Squirdle,

I thought I saw a squirdle, I think, I thought, I saw, I think, I thunk, I thought, I saw a squirdle by my door...

#### And ends:

So if I saw a Pussle Squonk, Yet heard a Squirdle roar, It means I think, I thunk, I thought, I'd seen what I had saw.

Or: A thousand hairy savages, Sitting down to lunch, Gobble, gobble, glup, glup, Munch, munch, munch.

Much like Robert Louis Stevenson, Spike Milligan also left a memorable epitaph,

I told you I was ill.

flowers, fish and books.


Recently, we have begun to have socially distanced whole school assemblies on the playground. This has



THERE IS A HINT OF IRONY IN THAT MARGARET'S GREAT-GRANDSON STILL LIVES IN THE PARISH AND HAS BEEN A HEADHUNTER FOR THE LAST 26 YEARS.



# IMPORTANT ADVICE FROM RBWM TRADING STANDARDS

## HAVE SMARTPHONE OWNERS BEEN OVERPAYING?

n interesting and rare class action is being brought by Consumer organisation "Which?" against the US-based company which developed the chipsets within smartphones. The claim is against Qualcomm relating to the chips which connect smartphones to 4G networks and owns the

The allegation is that they abused their dominant position in the marketplace, broke competition laws, and charged smartphone manufacturers, such as Apple and Samsung, inflated fees to use the technology. The knock-on effect was consumers paying higher prices for the affected phones.

patents for 4G technology.

Refunds of between £5 and £30 are due to be repaid to affected consumers if the class action is successful. This would cost Qualcomm in the region of £480 million in refunds. Up to 29 million UK smartphone owners are thought to have been affected for those purchased since 1 October 2015.

The legal claim has been filed with the Competition Appeal Tribunal which will decide if the claim can proceed. Further information on the case is available at www.smartphoneclaim.co.uk.



Qualcomm has rejected the claim by Which? and stated the case had "no basis."

"As the plaintiffs are well aware, their claims were effectively put to rest last summer by a unanimous panel of judges at

the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals in the United States," a spokesman told the BBC.

It is worth noting that Qualcomm has already been fined multiple times for unfair competition complaints, including two cases brought by the EU, over the past six years.





City of London Police have asked us to disseminate information on a new type of mobile phone upgrade scam.

Consumers are being cold-called by fraudsters impersonating employees of legitimate mobile network operators and suppliers.

Consumers are offered early handset upgrades, or new contracts, at significant discounts. Once

they have been convinced that the deals are genuine and agree to proceed, the fraudster then asks for their online mobile account credentials, including log-in details, address, and bank account information.





An order is then placed with a genuine mobile phone provider on behalf of the consumer; however, they deliberately select a different handset to that which was requested which is then shipped to the consumer's address.

Upon receipt, the fraudsters assure the consumer that the wrong handset was a postage error and instruct them to 'return' the handset to a different address (which is actually not affiliated to the mobile company - these addresses are usually residential).

The 'returned' handset is then intercepted by the fraudsters who then cease contact and the victim find themself stuck with no phone and liable for the entirety of a new contract taken out in their name.

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) have received over 300 reports from January 2020 to June 2021 with reported losses in excess of £86,000.

#### OUR ADVICE:

• If you are unsure that the person calling you is an official representative of the company they claim to be from, hang up and do not reveal any personal information.

- Only contact your mobile network provider on a number you know to be correct. For example, 191 for Vodafone customers, 150 for EE customers, 333 for Three customers, 202 for O2 customers, 4455 for Tesco Mobile, 789 for Virgin Mobile and 150 for Sky Mobile.
- If you receive a device that you did not order or expect, contact the genuine sender immediately. The details for this will be within the parcel.
- NEVER post a device directly to a given address. All genuine Mobile Network Operators would send out a jiffy bag for you to return without you incurring additional cost.
- Have a look at www.cyberaware.gov.uk for further advice and information.

## A VIEW FROM THE GARDEN


was so happy to see that hanging baskets have been put up in the village outside the shops on a morning walk, a sign summer is here!

There is now so much going on in my garden it has been rather difficult to decide what to share, all that rain followed by the sun has done its magic and the garden is all growing rather prolifically. I shall start with one of my favourite flowers, whilst short lived I adore poppies of all types. The bees have been having fun in these large petals. I found three in one flower when taking these photos (below). They are easy to care for as long as they have sandy, free draining soil and a sunny position. Deadheading will prolong flowering, take

out the whole stem or you can leave the heads to go to seed which you can collect or let nature takes its course and see where they pop up next year.

Aquilegias or Columbine/
Granny's bonnets are
another early flowering and
a typical cottage garden
plant. The diversity of colours
makes them highly desirable;
they are easy to grow and selfseed and are attractive to bees.

They grow in most soils and like a sunny or semi-shaded position. I grew these called 'lime sorbet' from seed a few years ago, they start blooming in their second year. I particularly like this variety as the flowers rise quite high above the foliage and they also make lovely cut flowers.



I grow several different clematis and this one called Marjorie is growing over a garden arch and is looking fabulous this year. She is growing in partial shade and flowers May to June and is fully hardy and suitable for a north-facing site. This climber is deciduous so will lose all its leaves in autumn. Clematis come in different groups which can be confusing, this is a group 1 which means no pruning is necessary. If the spread needs to be restricted, then prune immediately after flowering cutting back

overlong shoots to healthy buds. Apply a slow-release fertiliser and mulch of well-rotted compost around the base in early spring.

I talked a little about herbs I had chosen to grow last month, this is one I have not chosen to grow but pops up everywhere despite me constantly pulling it out! Borage! The flowers are a beautiful pure blue and I understand often chosen by Old Masters to paint the Madonna's robe. As I have found it difficult to eradicate from my garden, I decided years ago to find out how I could use it. The flowers can be sprinkled in salads and as a garnish or crystallized for cake decorations (dip in egg white and then caster sugar and leave to dry). I also pop them into jugs of Pimm's and they look very pretty frozen in ice cubes to serve in drinks. Young leaves can also be added to cold drinks for their cucumber flavour and cooling effect. Chop finely in salads, yoghurt, soft cheese or cook as spinach. The bees love the flowers and planted near to strawberries can stimulate their growth.

The vegetable and fruit garden are now all in full swing with radishes and lettuce being eaten and other culinary delights forming, just make sure you keep them all well-watered!



# Protecting Vulnerable Adults From Scam Phone Calls

Since 2015 Windsor and Maidenhead Trading Standards have installed 26 call blockers to protect older and vulnerable people. So far 5,606 nuisance and scam phone calls have been blocked, and we estimate that 6 scams have been prevented.

# Cost-Benefit analysis

It is estimated that over the 5 year life of these units they will have blocked 29,479 nuisance calls (of which 5,930 will have been scam phone calls), prevented 35 scams, saved vulnerable households £65,146 and led to a reduction of £58,953 in NHS and health & social care costs. This will be a total saving of £124,099 for a project cost of £4,030 – a payback of 31 times the cost.


