FROM THE EDITOR...

THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE

LENTEN TAKE UP...

The whole month of March this year falls into the church season of Lent. The 40 days before Easter where we take the opportunity to reflect on the sacrifice and journey Jesus made, 2,000 years ago, for the sake of the whole world. As we remember his sacrifice, Christians often give things up, our small acts of self-denial reminding us of his greater gift. Christians also use this period to take up particular spiritual disciplines or activities that help us connect with God and draw us closer into his presence. It's this latter action that I'd like to encourage you to think about this month, even

if like me you've given up caffeine or chocolate or some such. What is it, instead, that you might take up? What life giving, soul enriching practice that helps you connect with God's love, joy and peace might help you?

Now there is no one-size-fits-all activity here as it depends on your character, spiritual history and personality but whatever it is, find something that builds you up. It might be something alone or with others; something quiet or loud; something inside a beautiful building or

outside in the majesty of nature; something simple or complex; an action of rest or one of serving or petitioning. We can all take up something and put it in the diary as a take up for Lent this year.

The period of Lent also always contains Mothering Sunday, (perhaps we could take up being kinder to our mums) which traditionally was less about our mothers and more about 'Mother' church as families returned to their worshipping roots.

Perhaps your take up this year might be returning or going for the first time to a church service? This is an exciting time in the life of our parish as on March 1st, we are launching a brand new service, Ascot@3 (see page 10). This Sunday afternoon service complements our existing services which offer differing styles to suit various tastes.

- Our 8am Early Service at St Michael's offers the peace, quiet and traditional simplicity of Holy Communion.
- Our 9:15am Family Service at St Michael's is the perfect place for those with young children, and those who love the joy they bring. It's lively, full of song and drama, and finishes by 10am with biscuits and squash (and decaf tea for me in Lent).
- Our 10:45am Traditional Service at St Michael's enjoys the depth of the ancient liturgy of the Book of Common Prayer. With choir, organ and well known hymns, this community takes time and space to encounter God and then to share life over refreshments afterwards.
- Moving to All Souls, our 10:30am Service with Sunday school activities follows a more varied pattern, always offering a healthy mix of old and new in a warm, welcoming and uplifting community setting.

Into this mix, Ascot@3 will bring the opportunity to explore faith in a relaxed, informal and contemporary way. It is for all young people and adults, especially families with 9–15 year olds, and we believe that an afternoon time slot could be just right for those who struggle with church in the morning.

So what might you take up this Lent. Can you put church, your Mum or an activity that will refresh your soul in your diary – or perhaps all 3?

As in these 40 days we look forward to the amazing celebration of Easter, may your heart be led to God this Lent.

USEFUL ADVICE FROM RBWM TRADING STANDARDS

CBD CONFUSION

BD (Cannabidiol) can now be found in everything from foods/food supplements to cosmetics. We are often asked if they are legal and the answer is...it depends.

Cannabis plants are made up of more than 100 different cannabinoids. The most well know are THC, the ingredient that makes cannabis users high, and CBD which has no psychoactive effect.

In the UK, industrial hemp (the strain

which contains little or no THC. but does contain CBD) may be grown under licence These plants are then used for a range of things including building materials and clothina.

CBD AS A MEDICINE

If a product makes a claim that it can

treat or prevent disease it would be considered a medicine and therefore would need to be licensed by the Medicines and Healthcare Products Regulatory Agency.

CBD AS A FOOD /FOOD SUPPLEMENT

Historically, hemp oil was obtained by coldpressing the seeds; this sort of oil is currently legal as is hemp seed flour and can be sold freely.

Cannabinoids, including Cannabidiol (CBD) extracts and other derived product were deemed in January 2019 to be 'Novel Foods'. Novel Foods are foods that were not available on the EU market prior to May 15. 1997. They require prior authorisation before marketing. The Food Standards Agency has written to a number of companies advising them to become compliant with the law.

The quality and consistency of these foods are also in doubt: testing has shown that many do not have the stated amount of CBD in the product. Results have also found THC in them and these would fall under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 and would be a police matter; as would CDB teas which are made from the flower/ bud and leaf of the

cannabis plant (the controlled parts of the plant).

There is also a vast array of health and medicinal claims being made on these foods. There are no approved health claims for hemp or CBD and

therefore no claims should be made

In order to place cosmetics in the marketplace they must be tested for safety. Cosmetics should not be made from the buds or flowers and must not have any THC in them. No medicinal claims must be made.

HANNAH'S BLOG

12:06, 7 February 2020

few months ago, we had our work Christmas party. To be precise, it was the night of the General Election. A poorly-timed party, one might say, but we nevertheless had our fun, decorating ourselves with biodegradable glitter, face paint and the like to match our festive theme. We had a lovely sit-down meal in Brixton and enjoyed each other's company, catching up with London-based colleagues we hadn't seen in a while. We promised ourselves we wouldn't look at the exit polls come 10pm... but a few from the Oxfordshire team – myself included – couldn't help ourselves.

It was a sombre moment. There are very, very few people in my profession as a sustainability officer who would have felt indifferent to the result. A lot of us felt utterly devastated. Desperate. Anguished that the future of our planet – and our own lives – was scrawled over by childish bickering about Brexit stances, blatant lies, and media manipulation.

So our head of comms instantly ordered two rounds of tequila shots, which, for an organisation of varying ages, was a bold move. There was a strange solidarity in chucking back the salt-limeliquor concoction with a variety of my colleagues. But unfortunately, alcohol doesn't solve problems just like that and there was an inescapable and tangible sense of deflation in the air.

But this isn't a doom-and-gloom story. Because though I think I've lost faith in nationwide politics, I haven't given up on the brilliance and latent kindness of humans.

My organisation decided to run a Secret Santa this year, but instead of buying something, we were encouraged to donate to a charity we thought our selected person would support and appreciate money going towards, writing our reasoning for our choice of charity in a Christmas card. Receiving my card, I recognised the handwriting of our CEO, Sue. In awe-inspiring generosity, she had chosen to donate over £60 to a tree-planting charity that works with communities in the Global South on my behalf. Sue Riddlestone walks the walk. Her vision for a better future is not only compelling but achievable. She is a leader I can absolutely get behind.

Then the morning after, I woke up after a mostly-sleepless night, groggy and bleary-eyed. I

reluctantly turned up to a meeting I was meant to lead with a community action group in a little town called Wantage, looking to conduct an annual review of an action plan they had done with us, using our sustainability

framework. I expected to be underwhelmed, expected to hear about the difficulties they'd had in achieving their aims. Instead I was blown away by their determination.

A few days prior, they had set up a community fridge, offering free surplus food to members of the community who need it most. including Syrian refugee families. They have a vision to create a green conservation corridor around Wantage and map it out so that residents can see which patches of green are closest to them, to help tend them and cultivate them. To reclaim a sense of ownership and closeness with the land again. They've saved thousands of kilograms of "stuff" like old clothes and broken electronics from being thrown into landfill through their Repair Cafés, re-skilling people in learning how to fix while connecting them socially with other fixers. They're collaborating with other groups in the area to share bestpractice, workshops and training, and source

Yes, it's mighty difficult, especially in times of austerity when local authorities are understaffed, underfunded and under-resourced, to try and get high-level strategies and infrastructure sign-off. But I no longer believe change comes from the top. I believe in community-level empowerment through connection and learning and mutual support. I believe in people just doing it and bringing others along with them, showing them what's possible.

So, in the knowledge that services for the needy will further be cut and climate change not adequately addressed, here's what I think we could do. We should not wait for a political saviour. We should not wait for things to get better. We must be the instigators. Where you cannot find sunshine, be the sunshine.



I was born in Angola in a war zone. Fear was normal. My parents didn't travel during the day. My father would only go out after midnight and we kids travelled lying flat at the bottom of the car as they would shoot the drivers. My father is Portuguese and owned a general store in Angola, and my mother is Angolan. She left when I was three months old as his family made things so difficult for her. He later married again.

When I was sixteen, the family picked me up from school in the middle of the night. I didn't want to leave. I had hidden my passport so my dad had to get emergency papers at the airport. He was so angry! We went to live in my father's village in Portugal. We were suddenly so poor; there was no electricity, no toilets. We lived upstairs and the animals below. I went to college, and studied for a degree in psychology at Lisbon, until, despite working, I could no longer pay the fees. I found work in import/export as the company secretary and was doing well. Then I met my husband. He was full of dreams of an organic farm, so we moved to the countryside and had three children. But he drank and would sometimes become violent. One time he held a knife to my heart and said 'If you don't go now, I don't know what I will do.' We left. I worked during school times, but in the holidays we had no income. We lived in a tent. People would give us their surplus vegetables. They were so kind. When we moved to Pimlico I spoke only basic English, and the kids, not at all. I cleaned in B&Bs from 5am to earn money, and my ten-year-old had to care for the littler

ones. We lived in a room with a double bed for the children and a single bed for me. Then we moved here and the children went to local schools. I worked at the racecourse for events, and at the Berystede as a chambermaid.


While my eldest picked up English in six months, my younger ones struggled, one of whom was dyslexic. They found it difficult at school, and were bullied. We had rotten eggs and flour thrown at our door, and once we had to call the police in. They were spat at at Victory Fields, so I couldn't let them play there on their own. To learn English I would memorize whole phrases and answers, to make myself understood. Later I studied EFL at B&W College, and taught Portuguese privately in a company which later offered me a permanent job in their European Centre, where I still work. I also assist with Landmark Education, and raise money for local charities. I was a volunteer aid worker for the refugee camp at Calais. I have always had the belief that God will take care of us. I have always felt blessed by the divine.

What I most value here are the opportunities to work and grow. I miss the weather and the food in Portugal and the sense of family and community. In Angola, I miss the happy time before my dad remarried-the smell of the first rains — we'd get completely DRENCHED! I miss the vibrancy of life, and the termite mounds! I feel I belong to all these countries, but I am English. I love English humour and I dream in English! I feel cosy and safe inside. I feel sorrow has been my doorway to an open heart. I feel so blessed. May all beings be safe and happy and free.

MARCH RECIPE DANISH BUTTER CAKE



This is an old-fashioned and traditional recipe for Danish Butter Cake also known as Dagmar Tart.

INGREDIENTS:

For the Butter Cake

- 125g butter
- 250g strong white flour
- 1 egg
- 40g fresh veast
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 100 ml milk

Remonce (a Danish pastry filling made from gently mixing creamed butter and sugar)

- 50g butter
- 50g sugar

Filling

- 3 tablespoons apricot jam
- 3 tablespoons thick apple sauce
- 3 macaroons
- A handful of raisins

Stir the yeast into the lukewarm milk. Add the sugar, soft butter, egg and flour. Stir it all together, but not for too long. You may have to add a little more flour as it shouldn't stick to the bowl. Sprinkle it lightly with flour before leaving it to rise in a warm place for 20 minutes.

Cut the dough in half and roll out one part and place in a greased baking tin. Press the dough a little up the side of the tin. Spread the apricot and apple on to the dough.

Roll out the remaining dough into a rectangle, measuring approx 20 x 40cm. Stir the remonce until soft, then spread it on the rectangle. Crush the macaroons and spread on top with the raisins. Roll it together from the long side into a roulade. Cut this into 7 equal slices, dipping each one into flour before placing them evenly into the tin. Leave to rise, covered, in a warm place for 30 minutes. Bake in a hot oven at 180 degrees, fan or 200 for non-fan. Put a piece of foil over if it gets too dark. It should be nice and golden. Decorate with icing sugar and almond essence while still warm.
