



FROM THE EDITOR...

s I write this on April 9th, I have just heard that Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh has died at the age of 99. Married to our Queen, as Princess Elizabeth in 1947, he was unexpectedly thrust into the role of Consort when King George V1 died suddenly in 1952, and his new wife became Queen. I had occasion to photograph him at a couple of functions in the 1990s, once at Frogmore at a community dinner, and once



at Englemere on the occasion of his 75th Birthday, and found him to be courteous, friendly and indeed, helpful, in organising those around him for my benefit. His life was one of tremendous service and we shall miss him.

Talking of longevity, one of our readers has written in to say that the wedding photographs from the 1950s that we published last month, have reminded her of the fact that her parents, Florrie and Ted Kettle were married in St Michael's Church 96 years ago (when the Duke was only 3!). She then goes on to say that all eight of their children were also married there over the years. After this dreadful year we have all just experienced it is good to reflect on

how life goes on, how "we blossom and flourish like leaves on the tree, and wither and perish, but nought changeth thee".

Let's hope that the glorious month of May will see society blossom and flourish just as the earth gives forth its goodness and beauty after hibernating for the winter. Let's come out of our hibernation with the same vigorousness as nature does; after all, according to the latest wisdom from David Attenborough, we are part of nature, just as much as the flowers, greenery and small creatures that surround us.

A Happy month of May to you all as you vigorously (but carefully!) sally forth into the future.

THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE SERVICE AND DUTY

o much has been written about Prince Philip over this last month but through it all the key words that come back time and again are 'service' and 'duty'. Not common or popular words in our culture but maybe the time is ripe for their revival.

Both words say something about our relationship to other people.

Service, by whom we offer to help. Duty, to whom our allegiance is owed.

One indicates self-giving, the other self-sacrifice, one a downward or outward offering, the other an upward obedience. Both suggest a realisation that we are not the

centre of the universe and that our own needs do not come first. Challenging indeed.

So, if we look to follow Prince Philip's example, the guestions that follow are:

- Who are we serving?
- To whom do we have a duty?

The Duke of Edinburgh followed a well established pattern for public and military service, but whilst the claims of crown and country might not sit well with all, this pattern of service and duty can also be seen in the life of Jesus and his call to all humanity.

In one of the most poignant acts of his life and ministry Jesus, who the gospel writer John clearly identifies as divine, stoops down to wash his disciples feet (John 13:3-5). This was as dirty, smelly and menial a job as it sounds. Included in those washed feet were Judas', who Jesus knew would betray him, and Peter's, who Jesus knew would desert him. Through this significant act of service Jesus declares – 'Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet.' (13:14)

If you want to live a good life, if you claim to follow Jesus, if you respect the example of Prince Philip – which dirty, smelly, metaphorical (or literal) feet will you wash? Service is hard and often messy but it is essential for a fulfilled life.

Then at his darkest moment, when he knows the cross and death is imminent, Jesus shows where his allegiance lies. Luke's gospel describes Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane, praying in anguish, sweating blood (a medical condition called Hematidrosis), and crying out for God to change his course.

"Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done" (Lk 22:

Jesus' primary concern was that God's will be done, a prayer we echo in the Lord's prayer. How much courage does it take to offer that prayer when you have a sense that God's will won't bring you comfort or peace? Jesus knew that God's way was tough but that it was also good. His outward life of service stems from his upward sense of duty to his heavenly Father. Duty personified to the one to whom all allegiance is owed.

So if we want to follow the teachings of Jesus, if we honour the model of Prince Philip – to whom do we offer duty and allegiance? Is there someone who might know better how to live life than you or I do?

Service and Duty.

May we continue to be inspired by Prince Philip's legacy and let us take action in service and offer our lives to the call of duty.



his month I am focusing on poems about courage, perseverance and hope. In these difficult times most of us have had to dig deep within ourselves and face sometimes even just everyday things with more fortitude than usual. A poem I am very fond of is *Invictus* by WE Henley. I understand that both Gordon Brown and Nelson Mandela found strength in the poem in times of trouble. It begins:

Out of the night that covers me, Black as the pit from pole to pole, I thank whatever gods may be, For my unconquerable soul. And ends,

It matters not how strait the gate, How charged with punishments the scroll, I am the master of my fate, I am the captain of my soul.

One of Rudyard Kipling's best known poems is 'IF' and includes the lines:

If you can meet with triumph and disaster, And treat those two imposters just the same. esteem, and lets nothing get her down. It reads:

You may write me down in history, With your bitter twisted lies, You may hold me in the very dirt, But still like dust I rise. And in the final verse, Leaving behind nights of terror and fear, I rise,

Into a daybreak that's wondrously clear, I rise.

I find poetry can lift my spirit; and enjoy both reading and writing poems every day. However, I also find lines from the book of Psalms, although not strictly poetry, beautifully written, with thoughtful, strengthening and encouraging words.

The 23rd Psalm, *The Lord is my Shepherd* is well known to many, but Psalm 121, with the first line:

I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help.

And Psalm 62:

Truly my soul finds rest in God,
My salvation comes from him.

It is famously inscribed above the players entrance door to the Centre Court at

Emily Dickinson, is an American poet, whose work was not recognised in her lifetime, but has since been regarded as one of Americas foremost writers. Her poem 'Hope is the thing with feathers' begins:

Wimbledon.

Hope is the thing with feathers, That perches in the soul, And sings the tune without the words, And never stops at all.


Another American poet, Maya Angelou, was an inspirational writer. She was a Civil Rights activist and gifted in several areas of the arts. Her poem 'Still I Rise' is primarily about self-respect and confidence, and reveals how she can overcome anything through her self-

Both are uplifting and give hope and strength. To end, a poem by Langston Hughes, *Dreams*:

Hold fast to dreams,
For if dreams die,
Life is a broken winged bird,
That cannot fly.
Hold fast to dreams, For when dreams go,
Life is a barren field,
Frozen with snow.

With more 'normal' times on the horizon, I hope like me, you may find solace, strength and inspiration from poetry.

UPDATE FROM NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

The lockdown has resulted in many neighbourhoods drawing closer together in supporting local residents with needs, and in neighbours spending a lot more time talking to each other over fences or across the road. This has improved community spirit no end, and a great way to keep this spirit

alive is for residents to join their local Neighbourhood Watch scheme, or start up a new scheme if there is not already one covering their respective street.

Neighbourhood Watch is not just about looking out the window and being alert for any crime in the neighbourhood, it is much more than that. It serves as a valuable resource for crime prevention, in supporting the Police with things such as local home security surveys, installing crime prevention aids in homes for the vulnerable and elderly especially, helping those vulnerable and elderly residents with any other needs, and in drawing residents together in supporting one another.

The Windsor & Ascot NHW Association is making great strides in reactivating and expanding Neighbourhood Watch within the various parishes of Windsor & Ascot. Its Facebook page (@WindsorAscotNHW) is receiving multiple enquiries from interested residents and serves as a means to highlight local issues relating to crime and residents in need. New NHW schemes are continuously being set up with active Coordinators, and residents within those scheme areas can now benefit from the new initiatives being introduced by

Neighbourhood Watch and Thames Valley Police.

SAVE OUR WOODLAND!

The woodland area bordering the north side of Coombe Lane, Sunninghill was sold recently as a number of approximately half acre plots. The sale was made as "Woodland" (it is Green Belt), at great profit by the land speculator, but with a tentative incentive in the advertising that planning permission might be sought and given for development.

As development has increased in Sunninghill and Ascot environs, it has become increasingly important to maintain and preserve our precious wildlife and to maintain, or add to, the number of trees present, with all their beneficial effects. There are a number of hard and soft wood varieties in the area which provide a natural habitat for a wide variety of birds and animals. We should maintain this and not put it at risk of elimination.

The former owner always allowed pedestrians and dog walkers to use the woodland and enjoy it as a facility, boasting many bird species, including Buzzards, Red Kites, Tawny Owls, Woodpeckers, along with a whole host of smaller varieties. Two species of deer regularly inhabit and breed

in the woods. (The Duke of Edinburgh was responsible for re-introducing the deer to the area after the war). There are a variety of insects, snakes and bats living in the area along with rabbits and foxes and the beautiful flora and fauna which has remained until now, undisturbed for many years. Consequently, a Temporary Tree Preservation Order (TPO number 022/2020) was placed on the whole woodland which will expire in June 2021, designed to protect the area against change of use and possible development. Further protection needs to be sought for the woodland running along the railway line from Coombe Lane/Lower Village Road NNE towards St George's Lane and the wet woodland bordering the St George's Girls School playing fields to the North East, towards Wells Lane.

Do you think this Tree Preservation area is worth saving? Is allowing a green facility to be available in this highly developed area a good thing? Is helping wildlife beneficial to us all? Is the concreting of a potential flood area sensible?

If you do want to save our Green Belt, as a matter of urgency (time is nearly up), do

please communicate with the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead and support a Permanent Tree Preservation Order for the woodland for future generations to enjoy.

The Easter bunny had hidden some chocolate eggs at Allens Field so Beavers used their problem solving skills to decipher the clues. Samuel was awarded his Chief Scout Bronze Award, which is the highest award a Beaver can earn. He had to complete at least four activity badges and all six of the Challenge badges. Well done Samuel!

Cubs energetically played several wide games at South Ascot Recreation Ground at their meeting. Amongst the many activity & challenge badges earned during lockdown that were handed out to Cubs by Akela, Ava was presented with her Chief Scout Silver Award, which is the highest award a Cub can earn. To complete it, Ava had to earn at least six activity badges plus all seven of the Challenge Awards. The Silver Award shows that Cubs have given new things a go, played their part and stuck it out, even when the going got tough. It's a really big achievement, so well done Ava.

The Scouts learn how to do an 'M' check (a safety check) on their bikes as well as making sure their bike helmet is in good order. 



A VIEW FROM THE GARDEN

really know Spring is on the way when the clocks change, that

extra hour of daylight means I can potter in the garden after work and it's nice to see what is now waking up! I have a plum tree and cherry tree in pots and the flowers are just starting to open and I can see small swellings on the apple tree where it is also forming its flower buds.

The Pieris is now in all it's glory, covered in racemes of white flowers and the new leaf growth, which is bright red, will fade to a subtle pink and then finally green. It's a beautiful shrub and also enjoys the same conditions as rhododendrons which seem to thrive in this area. They like an acidic and lime free soil enhanced with leaf mould and are best grown in semishade. They are slow growers, I've included a photo here with a very well established one next to a red camellia in my garden, my husband said it looks like 'strawberries and cream'.

Last year I grew some strawberry plants very successfully in hanging baskets. It seemed to stop the slugs from being able to attack them and the birds also didn't seem to notice them as much, so I'm doing the same this year. I've tidied up my plants from last year, they overwinter well, cut off all the dead leaves and replanted in fresh soil with some added chicken manure pellets. They are standing on top of buckets in my greenhouse to give them a bit of a head start, and I'll hang them outside in the next week or so.

This month I thought I'd share a little on the benefits of companion planting and a more organic way of growing vegetables. I've planted more seeds in another vegetable bed, some more carrots and radishes so have a succession of vegetables to harvest, beetroot

and parsnips. I've also planted a row of French Marigolds and it's good to plant these near tomatoes as they can help to keep whitefly away. Nasturtiums deter aphids from attacking your beans, and the leaves and flowers can also be used in salads. Plant your alliums (onions) close to your carrots to ward off carrot root fly. Most companion

plants are strongly scented, mint for example confuses the pests of carrots, tomatoes, alliums and brassicas but grow in a pot as it spreads quickly by root runners. Garlic chives also work well planted near carrots and lavender works well to deter pests of carrots and leeks. Sage also confuses pests of brassicas and the leaves are often used when cooking poultry (think sage stuffing)!

In my other vegetable bed, I can see some progress, the broad beans are now a couple of inches high and the first sowings of radish are doing well and the carrots are coming through. It's important to keep the beds weeded so that they don't compete with your young plants taking important nutrients away. I was weeding at the weekend when a beautiful Peacock Butterfly landed among my carrots!

May is the month to plant your runner beans after all risk of frosts have passed, this is a job my husband likes to do. So ensure you have your bean canes put up securely and follow the instructions on the packet, you can plant these out directly into the ground, or you could start them off in toilet roll tubes as you need sufficient depth as they have long roots.

Protecting Vulnerable Adults From Scam Phone Calls

Since 2015 Windsor and Maidenhead Trading Standards have installed 26 call blockers to protect older and vulnerable people. So far 5,606 nuisance and scam phone calls have been blocked, and we estimate that 6 scams have been prevented.

It is estimated that over the 5 year life of these units they will have blocked 29,479 nuisance calls (of which 5,930 will have been scam phone calls), prevented 35 scams, saved vulnerable households £65,146 and led to a reduction of £58,953 in NHS and health & social care costs. This will be a total saving of £124,099 for a project cost of £4,030 – a payback of 31 times the cost.






