


THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE

certain priest was asked a question: "What is the most difficult thing about being a minister?" His answer was simple and straightforward – "to practice what I preach!", he replied. I can relate. I tend to preach thankfulness. I teach those around me to be grateful always, in every situation they find themselves. As ministers we also preside over God's altar in the church, which emphasises the call for thanksgiving (Eucharist). But I must confess that being thankful, simple as it may sound, is not something I always do enthusiastically. Gratitude requires us pause, reflect, and give thanks to God for

everything – whether little or big. The more we do that, the more we discover how blessed we truly are. We discover a new shiny window of light even in the darkest of hours – but more importantly, we discover that life is truly worth living. However, there is a general reluctance in giving thanks. Often it is something we think we can do without. It is no surprise that the bible teaches about the story of ten men who received their healing from Jesus, but only one returned to give thanks (Luke 17:11-19). This is a sad reminder of how we take for granted the value of thankfulness.

A helpful exercise that counsellors often suggest to marriages, is to let the couple identify what they are grateful for in their partner. The more they incorporate thankfulness everyday as their pulse of life, the more they discover the beauty and potential that lies within their relationship – a hidden diamond within each other. "Gratitude is the fairest blossom which springs from the soul." — Henry Ward Beecher. This is the same concept that David preaches unto himself: As the famous words go, "bless the Lord oh my soul" he says, and "forget not his benefits" (Psalm 103:2). In fact, thankfulness is a helpful catalyst towards our happiness. For it turns what we have into 'enough'. "It's the spark that lights a fire of joy in your soul." – Amy Collette.

Let's face it, we have been through a lot as a people. If you are reading this, then you survived the one of the most brutal pandemics this world has ever seen. Life always leaves us with something to worry about, but we can isolate the good things we see around us and be grateful for them. Of course, this is easier said than done, I know! How do you tell a victim of war in Ukraine who has lost about everything to be thankful? The truth is, there is always something to be grateful for, always!

This month as a parish, we are grateful to God for the joys of Easter, and His unconditional love expressed in His Paschal Mystery. We are grateful that more are finding God and making the most of their lives in their own special way, even in these difficult times. Not everyone who reads this shares our Christian faith, yes. But we can all be grateful to be part of this magnificent dance of life. We can all help each other through trying times, especially in this current economic climate. We can also be a brother's (or sister's) keeper in these tense ruthless war times. We need each other, and therefore, let us all be grateful for one another! Thank you!





parking is available at St Michael's church and in the Racecourse's Car Park 10. from where a park-and-ride bus will take you to Victory Field.



A VIEW FROM THE GARDEN

love the month of May, warmer days and time to plant out your summer bedding. We still need to be careful of the risk of frosts until the end of the month, you should protect any delicate plants with cloches or fleece if a frost is forecast. You can also now plant your hanging baskets. I have bought some coconut fibre liners this year and then I pop a bit of plastic or an old saucer in the bottom to help retain the water. Half fill the basket with compost with some slow-release fertiliser and some water retaining granules mixed in and push some up the sides. You can buy lovely selections of hanging basket flowers at the garden centres with a variety of trailing flowers and evergreens. Pop these and trailing lobelia around the edges, leaving only a thumb width between each plant. Then in

the centre place your main upright plant, I often use a geranium.

Then fill in all around the edges with the same compost mixture as above firming in between your plants. Water them in well, I will place mine on top of a bucket in my greenhouse for a couple of weeks before hanging out to try to give it a head start, but if you don't have a greenhouse, they should be fine to hang out, cover with fleece if a fierce frost is

forecast! My Peris was looking beautiful with its flame red new growth and then we had a heavy frost and it's spoilt it.

The cheerful flowers of the forsythia are now over and now is the time to give them a good prune. Without regular pruning forsythias tend to develop into tall, ungainly shrubs with congested growth and bare stems at the base. Cut back flowered growth to vigorous upward and outward facing shoots lower down. Also remove up to one fifth of the oldest stems from the base of the plant. This will encourage new strong shoots to sprout from the base. Flowers are borne on the new growth so don't leave it too late or you won't have any flowers next year. Forsythia is very easy to propagate, and this is how I grew mine, and is a great way to create new plants from some of the stems you have just pruned! I filled a trough with compost, trimmed the ends of the stems and removed any lower new leaves leaving about six inches of stem, dip in rooting powder and push into the soil. You could use pots, then keep watered. They should be ready for you to plant in their final place next spring.

The photo of the lime green zingy plant is a type of Euphorbia or commonly known as spurge. There are many varieties but this one seems to have arrived of its own accord in my garden and I've not yet identified which it is, but it seems to like a semi shaded spot and it

has spread but seems easy to pull out where I don't want it. I think I may move some as it will look lovely in another shady border that I have and set of the foliage of some other plants. You should cut off the flowers after blooming and always wear gloves when handling the plant, their milky sap irritates the skin and eyes, and is poisonous if ingested.

The grape hyacinths are now just going over, but naturalise very well, and are worth planting in a sunny spot. Still on the blue theme, the dainty flowers of Forget-me-nots have filled a border and will happily self-seed around your garden, they are a lovely filler for the border early in the year and seem to be happy flowering in sun or shade. I tend to allow them to seed and then pull many of them out making room for some summer bedding plants, knowing they will appear the following year.

This year I am growing some Cucamelon and have started some seeds in individual pots in my propagator. They look like miniature watermelons but are the size of

large grapes and taste like cucumber and are nice and crunchy. Great to pop in a lunch box and look so cute which may entice the kids to eat them! I will grow these up an obelisk, they are very easy to grow. I've also started off some cucumber and courgette seeds too.

A NEWS ROUND-UP FROM **RBWM TRADING STANDARDS**

BIRD-FLU IS OVER

We are delighted that the avian influenza outbreak we had in the borough has now officially been declared over. During early January a 3km disease control zone was put in place when bird flu cases were confirmed in a large number of swans. Restrictions in

movements and enhanced biosecurity measures were placed on bird keepers, dogs were required to be kept on the lead and it was not permitted to feed the wild swans in the riverside areas whilst measures were taken to bring the disease under control. Surveillance and control work was carried out and after a period of completion the control zone was lifted at the end of March enabling bird keepers, particularly keepers of commercial flocks, to go somewhat back to normal. Low level monitoring is still taking place to ensure the disease is not returning to the area.

CHARTER SIGNED WITH ROYAL WINDSOR HORSE SHOW

Trading Standards secured Real Deal accreditation for the show's shopping stands, signing a charter

demonstrating a commitment to providing a safe and fair shopping experience by preventing counterfeit or illicit goods being sold and maintaining the very highest standards with the retail offerings.

The Royal Windsor Horse Show is the UK's largest outdoor horse show regularly featuring around 200 shopping stands and attended by 55.000 people from across the world. A further 18,500 people will be coming to watch the Platinum Jubilee Celebration this year.

Traders are already carefully vetted by the organisers, with support from Trading Standards, who ensure they are legitimate businesses. Checks are made on what is being sold and where the products are made or sourced from, that prices are displayed, business contact details are shared so that

> customers know how to contact them and that the highest level of customer service is provided.

The Real Deal accreditation will strengthen this partnership working. At the heart of the campaign is a national markets' charter. which sets out key principles for market operators, local authority Trading Standards services and industry and trademark representatives to sign up to and abide by.

Not only does this agreement provide greater confidence for consumers, ensuring they can enjoy the shopping experience with peace of mind, it supports the legitimate businesses who attend and prevents them from being potentially undercut by others who may be attempting to sell counterfeit or substandard goods.

Visitors will be able to confidently shop at this event, buying safe, legal products and properly labelled goods which are accurately described, clearly priced, and from retailers they can identify and get back to in the event there are any issues with their purchase.

VIDEO DOORBELLS

The trading standards service have been supporting vulnerable residents and helping to deter doorstep scams by installing video doorbells. We started with our list of known vulnerable residents - people who may have been targeted by scammers previously and where we had already conducted some safeguarding work with them or put in place other preventative measures such as a telephone call blocker. We identified a Cheapside resident to do our first test installation and successfully fitted the device in early April, allowing the resident to see who is at the door by viewing it on their tablet or smartphone before deciding whether to open the door.

We are not currently taking any new requests from residents specifically for these devices as we already have a sufficient number to assess. However, if you feel you would benefit from a safeguarding visit, scams advice, a video doorbell or call blocker at a later date please do contact us.

BANK SCAMS

During March the Chartered Trading Standards Institute (CTSI) urged UK consumers to be on the lookout for scams as it supported World Consumer Rights day, which this year focused on Building Fair Digital Finance. Consumers International report that the UK has been branded 'bank scam capital of the world'.

Trading Standards have a key role to play in keeping UK consumers safe when shopping online, especially as consumers are facing increased financial hardship with the

cost-of-living crisis.

CTSI Chief Executive Officer, John Herriman said:

"The cost-of-living crisis will lead fraudsters to exploit the public, especially the most vulnerable, who may fall victim to scams or unfair practices as they look to save money when shopping online or looking for finance deals. "Regulators must work together to plug

the gaps in a rapidly evolving online marketplace. Despite significant reductions to budgets in the last decade, trading standards services work in partnership with other agencies, going above and beyond to protect consumers."

The consumer landscape has changed so rapidly over the last couple of years, many people have changed how they do many of their day-to-day activities. We rely on digital and cyber technology more and more, from our smart phones through to our computers. Scammers have also seen the changes in digital culture and have therefore adjusted their tactics to ensure that their criminal networks flourish at a time when the UK is struggling.

Trading Standards see prevention as a key pillar in the foundations of tackling scams and the criminals who operate behind the scenes. We urge consumers to question transactions, take time to think and never respond to any pressure to part with goods or money. Consumers should never be embarrassed in reporting a scam, because we as enforcement agencies need this information to work together to ensure consumer protection measures are strong enough that the scammers are disrupted and taken to task.





SPOTLIGHT ON YOUR LIBRARY

POETRY CORNER

hen the power of love, overcomes the love of power, the world will know peace."

Quote attributed to Jimi Hendrix. I happened to be reading this quote just as the tragic and deadly events began to unfold in Ukraine early in March. I began to think of suitable pieces focusing on peace and war, not just poetic, but also in the words of songs, mainly from the sixties, when the world again felt unstable and dangerous. Bob Dylan who recently received the Nobel prize for Literature, wrote in the lyrics to Blowing in the Wind,

How many times must the cannon balls fly, Before they're forever banned? and also.

How many times can a man turn his head, And pretend that he just doesn't see, And ending,

How many deaths will it take 'till he knows, That too many people have died? With the refrain, The answer my friend is blowin' in the wind.

In *Turn, Turn, Turn,* written by Pete Seeger, with words from the Bible, Ecclesiastes Chapter 3, reads.

A time of love, A time of hate, A time of war, A time of peace.

And ends.

A time for love, A time for hate, A time for peace, I swear it's not too late.

Another quote from Psalm 3 reads,

I lie down and sleep,

And wake again because the Lord sustains me.

I will not fear that tens of thousands assail me on either side.

Muriel Rukeyer, was an American poet also writing in the 1960s. In her work *Poem*, she describes a turbulent world and the difficulties of reconciliation.

'I lived in the first century of world wars, Most mornings I would be more or less insane.

The newspapers would arrive with their various stories.

And the news would pour out of various devices.'

Alfred Noyes was an English poet and author. He married an American, and went to America in 1913, to lecture on World peace and disarmament. In his poem *On The Western Front,* he writes,

We who lie here have nothing more to pray, To all your praises we are deaf and blind. We may not ever know if you betray, Our hope to make earth better for mankind.

Henry Wadsworth Longfellow 1807- 1882, is one of the few American poets to be honoured in Poets Corner in Westminster Abbey. His poem *Christmas Bells*, was his heartfelt reaction to the Civil War.

Then pealed the bells more loud and deep, God is not dead, nor doth he sleep, The wrong shall fall, the right prevail, With peace on earth, goodwill to men.

Thomas Wyatt 1503-1542, was an English poet, who also lived through turbulent times – The Reformation and Dissolution of the Monasteries. His poem *I find no Peace*, reflects on the turmoil in his mind and lack of inner peace. It begins,

I find no peace, and all my war is gone, I fear and hope, I burn and freeze like ice, I fly above the wind, yet can I not arise.

I leave you with reflective words by Issac Pennington, a Quaker:

Our life is love, and peace, and tenderness, And bearing one with another, And forgiving one another, And not laying accusations one against another.

But praying one for another, And helping one another up with a tender hand.

We all feel desperately for the people of Ukraine, we can pray for them, and do anything we can practically to relieve their suffering. And fill our own hearts and homes with love.





Our church, like many, has suffered from declining funds over the last few years and this has been exacerbated by the Covid Pandemic.

Members of the congregations have been asked to suggest fund-raising activities and I have proposed a 'Friends of St Michael & All Angels 100 Club'. This would be a nonprofit arrangement and would work on the basis of members paying a fixed amount of £10 per month, on a standing order basis, with the aim of eventually having 100 participants. Initially 50 members would be a good start.

The proposal is that 2/3 of all receipts would go to the Church and 1/3 would be paid out to winners drawn from the pot of contributors, between the two services, in the Church

Hall, on the first Sunday in every month, starting in June.

If this were to be popular and 100 monthly entries were received, the total contribution each month would be £1,000, and thus £12,000 in a year, of which £8,000 would benefit the Church.

I do hope that you would see this as something of a fun event as well as at the same time being a fairly painless but beneficial way to help our Church's ailing finances.





THE BALLETS RUSSES: WHEN ART DANCED WITH MUSIC

Ms Jennifer Toynbee-Holmes MA

When Diaghilev created ballet in the west in the early twentieth century, he brought extraordinary revolutionary energy from Russia. By bringing together talented artists of different disciplines; choreographers, dancers, musicians, designers and painters; Fokine, Nijinsky, Stravinsky, Prokofiev, Picasso and Coco Chanel to name but a few, Diaghilev fused the latest in art, music and dance in spectacles that dazzled and astonished audiences around the world.

The dream Diaghilev created of dance joining hands with the other creative disciplines to



create a total work of art changed the course of ballet forever. Using stills and video clips we take an exciting look at the Ballets Russes that dominated the ballet stages of the world from its explosion in Paris in 1909 until Diaghilev's death in 1929.

Jennifer Toynbee-Holmes is an experienced guide at Tate Britain and Tate Modern and lectures at various art societies and institutions. She has a special interest in British and European art of the late 18th, 19th and early 20th century. Having gained an MA in film and television practice, Jennifer had a long-standing career spanning twenty years as a television producer/director making documentaries and factual programmes for the BBC, ITV and Channel 4.
