



THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE LIFE IS JUST A JOURNEY HOME

s we're not currently allowed to sing in church, in our Sunday services we've done a lot more listening to music, songs and hymns instead. We've used the music to quide our reflections, hopes and pravers and it's created a lot more space to stop and think.

One such song that we played the other week was 'Life is just a journey home.' (from the album 'Hold On' by Trent). When life is so busy, or the pressures of

the pandemic, the 24hr news feed, and the worries of the future can seem overwhelming, this simple melody and haunting lyrics enabled me to gain a new perspective, one not solely focussed on the now. Rather that the promise of God is that we're on a journey home, to be with Him, both now and forever.

'Sometimes I feel like I'm falling Sometimes I feel higher than the stars Sometimes I can hear you calling Sometimes I feel lost But then I lift my eyes up I see where I belong... Life is just a journey home.'

This truth reminds us that whatever I or you are experiencing right now, it will pass. It encourages us to lift our eyes and imagine a better future. It gives us confidence as we

know he's not just the destination but also the friend we can walk with. As it also demands a small but significant effort from us to take a simple step in the direction he lays out.

This is, of course, not a new thought. The Old Testament book of Ecclesiastes reminds us that 'God has planted eternity in the hearts of humanity' (Ecc 3:11) – deep down we long for it to be more than just this.

The New Testament letters of Hebrews and of 1 Peter (Jesus' fisherman friend) calls us 'strangers and foreigners' on earth, longing for a different home. In many ways this life is not meant to be comfortable or self satisfying for we would be settling for second best.

In the words of another, more famous hymn:

'For there's another country I've heard of long ago most dear to them that love her, most great to them that know....'

So may I encourage you to take your next step. There is a future with God waiting for you and a place prepared for you. Today will pass, tomorrow will be glorious.

OBITUARY Hannah Vann

fter nearly 50 happy years of living near South Ascot our mother passed away just after her birthday this year. March marked the four cornerstones of her life over a stretch of 93 years - when she was born, married, died and buried.

Hannah (Anna) Cumisky, born to a lowland Scots-Irish family always reflected on her "wonderful" life. The second of eight children born to Peter and Isabella in Ayrshire. Her surname was Gaelic and she had Hibernian looks with thick, dark, curly hair.

She treasured memories of her own mother who passed away when she was only 12. Her father brought up the family through the war, even coping with a London family evacuated to their council house!

Leaving school at 14 to work in a carpet factory then in a shoe shop, at 19, her cousin asked her to go down to England where they both found work at Interflora in Leicester but she maintained close contact with family in Scotland.

Anna would go to the Co-Op canteen where she soon caught the attention of a young electrician called Tony. They met again at a Saturday dance and after three years together, got engaged. After Tony's National Service they married and moved to Abingdon, Northampton, Dursley and then Cookham during which time their four children were born.

In 1971, they moved to their final house where Anna found contentment. She loved being a housewife. It was her job and she was proud of it and was always busy. She often used to cycle up to Ascot and the village with her shopping bags swaying on the handlebars.

Anna especially enjoyed looking after their five lovely grandchildren: Marlisa,



Charlotte, Annabelle, Madeleine and Nathaniel whom they loved dearly. After Tony's death in 2016, Anna went occasionally to local groups and lunches at All Souls' but struggled with deafness and cataracts which became very limiting but her aood humour persisted.

She enjoyed Sunday lunches with friends at Lynwood whose lovely care team looked after her at home. They were uplifted by her cheerfulness and the many stories of her life. She had a grateful temperament stemming from her deep Christian faith.

Her sister, brother, cousin, children and four of her grandchildren survive her. They would like to send their thanks to the Lynwood care team and to the nurses from Thames Hospice who also came, like angels, to look after her at home.



FLIGHT OF THE CONCORDE

Apologies to Judith and all Concordians for my schoolboy error. But it has provoked a very interesting article from her about her time on the iconic aircraft! - Ed.

Those of you who know me will probably be aware that I spent my working career as an air stewardess from 1969 until 2006 working for the then world's favourite airline, BEA/British Airways! It is in this context that I wrote to the Editor following his leading article in the August edition of our Magazine where he had mentioned that Concorde had been "scrapped after 14 years". I could not let such a comment go unchallenged because I worked on this iconic aircraft for twenty years and as a result of bringing this to his attention, he has asked me to share some of my experiences with you.

British Airways operated seven Concordes

and from a total workforce of 14,000 cabin crew, just 200 were assigned to the Concorde Fleet (6 per flight) crewing the twice daily scheduled flights to New York as well as thrice weekly to Washington/Miami. Passengers totalled 100 and sat in comparative luxury in a confined space compared to today's First Class mode. In those days a single ticket to New York would cost approximately £4,000 - approx £17,265 today!

Concorde flew at a height of 57,000 feet at a speed of 1,350 mph and we reached New York in three hours twenty minutes. A Jumbo on the same route would take roughly seven hours! Working on this aircraft was quite exhausting because whilst caring for demanding passengers we were constantly walking uphill toward the flight deck or downhill to the rear and this was because at this height the aircraft flew



There was tremendous joy (and anticipation) in dealing with our passengers because the rich and famous often travelled to New York or back and thus I met wonderful personalities such as Margaret Thatcher, Nelson Mandela, David Frost etc., numerous rock groups and actors as well as royalty. I started to keep an autograph book and such celebrities were (mostly!) amenable to my requests. I now have a treasure trove of happy memories contained within its pages. Even those whose autograph I sought were impressed with the range and star quality contained therein.

Operational requirements meant that on three occasions, I was even asked to travel to New York and back within a day; hard work but enjoyable. There was the time when a group of rich Americans chartered Concorde to undertake a four week round-

the-world holiday and I was fortunate enough to enjoy the first leg of two weeks of this journey going West to Dallas, Hawaii, Fiji and Sydney (via a reception at the Opera House!) and disembarking at Hong Kong where our duties were to host an official farewell/handover dinner in order to brief the crew who were undertaking the next stage of the final leg. I was then able to return home - First Class! - a reward for all our hard work. I undertook many trips over the Bay of Biscay where we were permitted to fly supersonically. On these flights, with a duration of 11/2 hours, our passengers enjoyed champagne and a light luncheon. These passengers were generally celebrating a special occasion in their lives and it was totally satisfying to see the tears of joy and excitement on their faces.

Destinations were limited because of the noise and runway length but we were able to fly to places such as Barbados, Tampa, Phoenix, Omaha and Toronto, Iceland and Greenland. The warm and sometimes rapturous welcome given to us by the American public made us feel like film stars. As a result of us being part of a relatively small fleet, close friendships were made which I still maintain to this day.

Tragedy struck in July 2000 when the Air France Concorde from Paris crashed on takeoff killing all 109 people on board as well as four others on the ground. That was the first and only accident involving this aircraft in 31 years of flying. I was due to fly to New York the following day and despite the sombre mood prevailing at that time, we completed the trip but Concorde was grounded shortly following that until 11 September 2001. In the intervening period, I was flying short haul flights around Europe but on this day, Concorde flew into New York and landed shortly before the World Trade Centre became the target of a terrorist attack. Public misgivings concerning overall safety, spiralling maintenance costs and lack of demand led to the joint decision by BA and Air France to retire my beloved Concorde. The last time Concorde took to the skies was November 2003 when it flew "home" to Filton, Bristol where it had first taken off 50 years earlier. I have never met anyone who did not marvel at the take off or landing and despite the huge noise, this aircraft in flight was such a joy to watch and instilled a sense of pride that is unparalleled to this day.

Working on Concorde was a glamorous and fulfilling period in my career despite the arduous work involved and would I do it all again? Without a doubt! My flying career occurred during the best of times for aviation and I was very fortunate and proud to be part of the era when BA was the world's favourite airline.

PHISHING - DON'T TAKE THE BAIT!

S and the internet are now such a fundamental part of daily life that we would struggle without them – online banking and shopping, emails, social media and more...but if you use any of these devices you most likely receive suspicious calls, emails, texts or other messages

on a regular basis and are therefore put at risk of cyber crime and phishing.

The purpose of phishing is to commit fraud by obtaining your personal data, your login and password information and your personal or financial details such as bank accounts, credit and debit card numbers. They cast out a hook and see if you take the bait for them to reel your data in.

In a phishing message, the goal is often to convince you to react quickly, without thinking and to click a link. Once clicked, you may be sent to a dangerous website which could download viruses onto your computer, and/or steal your passwords and personal information.

Over the phone, the approach may be more direct, asking you for sensitive information, such as banking details by posing as an organisation you trust. This could be your Internet Service Provider, local council or other familiar government department.

It is more important than ever to take steps to prevent cyber criminals getting hold of your account information.

The National Cyber Security Centre's Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS) received over 1.7 million reports from the public between April - August



2020, with the most commonly faked messages using TV Licensing, HMRC and GOV.UK. Up to the end of this period they had received more than 2.3 million reports of phishing which enabled them to identify and remove 9,315 scams and a further 22,237 URLs. The name and reputation of any

recognised or trusted institution could be used, often it is services such as passport renewals, applying for a blue badge, driving licence renewals and so on...but the scammers constantly evolve to tap into the latest current thing, so right now track and trace, Government Covid-19 information, NHS or Rishi Sunak's new Green Homes Grant might be ones to be particularly wary of.

Here are some top tips to protect yourself and your devices;

• Email – if you have received a suspicious email report it to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS) at report@phishing.gov.uk This simple step will help protect many more people being affected.

• Text message – suspicious messages should be forwarded to 7726 (this spells SPAM on the keypad). This free-of-charge short code enables your phone provider to investigate the origin of the text and

take action if it is found to be malicious.

 Install the latest software and app updates on your devices, security features are constantly getting updated – information to help with this can be found



from the legitimate Apple, Microsoft and Google websites.

• Enable two-factor authentication (2FA) on your email account – this is the best thing you can do to improve the security of your important online accounts, such as your email. 2FA is where you need to use both a password and a random 6digit code which is then sent to your mobile phone. If your password is stolen, they still need your phone. If your phone is stolen, they still need your password. This system can even

be used for internet-enabled video game consoles. See:

https://www.telesign.com/turnon2fa/tutorials

• Secure smartphones and tablets with a screen lock - each time you want to unlock your device or switch it on, you'll be asked to enter a PIN, password or fingerprint. This

means that if someone gets hold of your device they can't access the data on your device without entering your password, pattern, PIN or fingerprint. Also turn on backups to keep your data safe.

• Above all, keep your wits about you. Sometimes the scam sites copy the logos and artwork of legitimate sites and then pay for their advert to go to the top of search engine results. Look carefully at the

page, look at the secure URL; and look for the padlock symbol.

FRAUD ALERT

Here's a sad story we have had reported recently from Action Fraud:

aller is reporting that her mother has been a victim of fraud. As a result a huge amount of money has been removed from her bank account. It started with a text on 01/08/20, from a number claiming to be PayPal. It stated that her 'PayPal account had been suspended, due to irregular activity'. The victim clicked on the link. It looked like a genuine PayPal website, so she proceeded to enter all her account and security details. On 06/08/20, she received a text, claiming to be from her bank, which said that her debit card had been used illegally on 05/08/20. 'If this was her, please reply yes, otherwise, please reply no'. 'There is no need to call us, responding to this text, is the quickest way to update your account'.

The victim replied 'no' and received an immediate confirmation from the 'bank', which stated that they would call her back or she could call them on a number they gave her. She received a call from the 'bank', stating that the card would be blocked. She received another phone call on Friday, stating that they needed to create three new accounts and to transfer all her funds to those accounts, to protect her money.

All her savings were transferred to those accounts between 8th Aug and 9th August. The real bank has

been spoken to and they have raised their own independent fraud investigation. As we have seen from previous investigations, the bank suspends the account for 150 days, while they try and track the money – but there is no guarantee they will recover it. Fraudsters usually transfer the money into other accounts and then immediately transfer it again, through dozens of accounts world-wide.

These frauds and scams are happening every day and fraudsters are getting away with millions, just with a couple of phone calls. Please speak to everyone you know and ask them to pause and think, before doing anything someone on the phone asks them to. You have no idea who they are – and you must never phone a number that they give you.

Stop, think and pause before responding. In this case, go online into your PayPal account and make sure what you are being told is true. If the call supposedly comes from your bank, ring them from your account statements, or better still, go in and talk to someone.

→ Never give someone on the phone your bank details or click on a link in a text to do it.

 → Never agree to transfer your savings to a secure/safe account - whoever asks you to do it - unless you are in your bank and they suggest it. But they won't. They will protect your existing account.
 → A huge amount of money has been transferred and lost this way - don't let it happen to you or someone you know!



CHAPMANS OF SUNNINGHILL 40 YEARS ON!

I called in to get some pictures of Robert, Denise and the staff following this article by Robert and his description of the business is too modest! Chapmans is our National Treasure and long may it remain so. With Robert on the photos are his wife, Denise and Beverley Crompton (dark hair) who has been with the shop for 20 years. Robert's 4 sons have all served as Saturday assistants in their youth, and Richard, his eldest, helped during Covid-19 to keep the business open right from the start. – Ed

On the 30th August 1980 I started a new career, which was to run Chapmans in Sunninghill as a 23year-old. 40 years ago I knew very little about the business of ironmongery. Luckily I inherited the existing staff: Jim Watts who was in his late 70's and had joined the firm just after the end of the First World War and Gertie Russell, a lady in her 80's who spent the day whistling under her breath. I later found out that she was my grandmother's first cousin. They must have thought; "Who is this boy trying to run this business without much of an idea?" They were right. They liked me; one reason being that I doubled their wages in my first week. I will add that they were earning 44p an hour at the time. I on the other hand had to halve my wages in order to allow the business to grow.

I also kept the existing Saturday boy, Lino Temis, a local schoolboy whose Italian parents lived in Sunninghill. His mother





used to make pizza for lunch occasionally which was wonderful as it was authentic and homemade. It was these staff who taught me the ropes of this business and gave me my grounding.

I soon learned, and enjoyed the village. I kept the name as it had been known as Chapmans since 1895. I found that although it was hard work, it paid off. The customer would always come first, regardless of what you were doing, you would stop and attend to the customer as it is they who are paying your wages. Even in those days there was plenty of competition, as every village and town would have its own hardware shop. There were 'Do It All' and 'Wicks' type businesses and my attitude to these were that there are customers who would always use these shops, but there were customers who would rather use mine. I had to make it so that it was a pleasant experience to

shop with me and hopefully they would return.

The village itself has changed drastically over the past 40 years. In 1980 we had 2 butchers, a fishmonger's, a gas showroom, a bank, 2 greengrocers, 3 newsagents and only 1 restaurant. Toni International and Matthews were the hairdressers. Gudge Ward was the barber, an elderly man who had the shakes. No cafés and no estate agents.

We have seen a few recessions and have managed to pull through to the other side. I have always felt that being a village, Sunninghill doesn't experience the peaks in boom times, but doesn't then have the lows. And here we are now with this unprecedented Covid-19 outbreak. That's another story for another time!

One of my favourite locations is Old Winchester Hill in Hampshire.


