

### THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE

### AND THEY ALL ATE AND WERE SATISFIED (Luke 9.17)

s I write this, preparations are well advanced for the funeral of our immensely loved Queen Elizabeth II in a few days time, and King Charles III is working extremely hard to keep this country on the same track as she followed, supporting and caring for everyone. Our Royal family, our lifestyle and our freedom are admired by so much of the world. The King has seen that we can all be cared for and I feel sure he would be supportive of our Harvest services taking place early in October.

As for this year's harvest our garden has suffered a bit in the hot summer - the first time we've had failure with the runner beans but there's still plenty of produce to remind me it is harvest time. "The ripe fruits in the garden, He made them everyone" - as the hymn says. And isn't it rewarding to go and pick what we have? Our farmers, too, have struggled, with crops and with people to harvest them - putting up prices. There are other forms of harvest afterall until the Industrial Revolution most people worked on the land - now it is more a harvest of our talents and the reward we receive for their use.

Two thoughts immediately come to mind:

- How fortunate we are to live in this area where most of us have plenty of food. We need to share so that others don't go hungry.
- The planet has suffered by our overuse of the soil, fossil fuels, trees and so much more. We need to take care to preserve it for future generations, allowing them too to have life and have it abundantly.

Our two churches will hold Harvest Festival services on the first two Sundays of October -All Souls on 2nd October and St Michael's on 9th. There is bound to be an awareness of the amazing heat of our summer this year, the failure of crops; the fires; the floods; the war in Ukraine and all that has contributed to poor harvests throughout the world. Then the enormous significance of the resulting increase in the cost of food in much of the world and the shortage of some produce - all leaving some hungry at a time when fuel prices are rising so fast!!

In order to help, we collect, either directly or indirectly for global charities but on this occasion we shall be collecting in different ways for two local organisations that can benefit from our harvest donations. For individual items the local foodbank is always grateful and will be needing to support more people this winter; so cans of ordinary foods will be much appreciated. And for those who'd like to make financial donations Food 4Children, a fairly new local charity, would appreciate any help through their website.

It's been a tough year for many. Jesus fed 5,000 local people from 5 loaves and 2 fishes, with 12 baskets left over: all through prayer and local help. That is the only miracle recorded in all four gospels (eq Luke 9.10-17) and therefore of specific significance: I pray we can do something similar.





### **POETRY CORNER**

Delicious Autumn! My very soul is wedded to it, and if I were a bird, I would fly about the earth seeking the successive Autumns!

George Eliot

feel very blessed that the view from my window is full of trees. They are all different, not just in size, shape and leaf, but also in the way they move and change colour. On a windy day, the trees with larger leaves, such as maple, tend to move slowly in an up and down movement, whilst the smaller leafed trees, such as the silver birches, hustle, bustle and rustle seemingly busier. In Autumn their colours change from shades of green to varying shades of yellow, ochres, gold and brown. One has to begin an Autumn Poetry Page with *Ode to Autumn* by John Keats, possibly the best known autumn poem. The opening line reads,

'Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness, Close bosom-friend of the maturing sun, Conspiring with him how to load and bless, With fruit, the vines that round the thatcheves run.

And continues

*To fill all fruit with ripeness to the core, To swell the gourd, and plump the hazel shells.* 

Contrast this with another poem entitled Autumn by Thomas Hood, which describes autumn in altogether more melancholy terms. Other poets have written about autumn in this way likening it to death, the dying of nature. But it dies only to sleep through winter and come alive again in Spring.

But here the Autumn meloncholy dwells, And sighs her tearful spells, Amongst the sunless shadows of the plain, There is enough of withered everywhere, To make her bower, - and enough of gloom.

In the poem *Fall leaves fall*, Emily Brontë wishes away the leaves and flowers of summer so that Autumn can come. She looks forward to winter, and leaves the reader wondering why.

Fall, leaves, fall, die flowers away, Lengthen night and shorten day! Every leaf speaks bliss to me, Fluttering from the autumn tree. I shall smile when wreaths of snow, Blossom where the rose should grow, I shall sing when nights decay, Ushers in a drearier day.

If you often read this page, you may recognise my love of the works of Robert Louis Stevenson. I try to include his poems as it is suitable for younger readers. *Autumn Fires.* 

In the other gardens, And all up the Vale, From the autumn bonfires The grey smoke towers.

Sing a song of seasons! Something bright in all! Flowers in the summer Fires in the fall!

I end with the delightful poem *Diary of a Church Mouse* by John Betjeman. The "mouse" describes his time spent in the church, and while other church festivals come and go, Harvest Festival is his joy, with food a plenty. It begins,

Here among long discarded cassock, Damp stools, and half split open hassocks, Where the vicar never looks, I nibble through old service books. and

For me the only feast at all, Is autumn's Harvest Festival, Where I can satisfy my want With ears of corn around the font. I climb the eagle's brazen head, To burrow through a loaf of bread, I scramble up the pulpits stair, And gnaw the marrows hanging there. The poem ends, But all the same it's strange to me, How very full the church can be, With people I don't see at all, Except at Harvest Festival.

So don't be a stranger at Harvest Festival. There are accessible services at both St. Michael's and All Souls during the first week in October. Come and join the congregation, and celebrate God's gifts to us all, important in the times we find ourselves.

### **A VIEW FROM THE GARDEN**

Ve got an aubergine! But it is my only one. They need a lot of warmth and sun to crop well so this year should have been perfect, however, I've so many tomato and chilli plants squeezed into my greenhouse I'm not sure they received enough sun. Someone also asked me the other day if I had been 'tickling' them, I haven't, and it may have been too late to try but I have 'tickled' them to aid pollination and will see if anything occurs! The tomatoes have been amazing and I've so many that I've looked at a further method of preserving. Put some baking parchment on a baking tray, cut your tomatoes in half and sprinkle with some sea salt and put in a low oven 120/130 degrees centigrade for 1.5-2 hours, I turned my oven off after 1.5 hours and left overnight, it could take longer with larger tomatoes, and you may need to remove some seeds. You can

then either store in a jar and pour over some olive oil, they will keep for a few days in the fridge, or I packed into a freezer container without the oil, and plan to defrost what I need throughout the winter and will add olive oil to them once defrosted to plump them a bit before adding to pasta dishes, salads, stews etc. We've

also lifted more potatoes and Charlotte has been the most successful. maybe that why we see this most often in supermarkets during the summer.

I grow Japanese Anemones in my garden, and they bring a real boost to the late summer and autumn flower garden, their heads dancing in the breeze. They will grow in any soil in almost any situation including deep shade. They grow in clumps and selfseed. These flowers have a lot of pollen so are good food for our pollinators. They have pink or white flowers and varieties grow from

20 inches to 5 foot and they don't need much attention and are easy to care for.

I have two hibiscus. one is single pink flower with red centre and the other is a double pink flowered variety. Hibiscus can be deciduous or evergreen, annuals or perennials, but they flower over a long season. They like a neutral soil in full sun in a warm position and we are probably most familiar with

and yellow which close in dull weather. I grew these from seed and have been delighted with their continuous show of flowers over the summer. just deadhead regularly. Great for the front of a border or gravel garden, they are also very happy in coastal regions. I've also grown these

pretty Verbena bonariensis from seed too. It's very attractive to

butterflies and has beautiful bright purple flowers and can grow to be 150 cm tall. They like full sun in well drained soil and don't take up much room so look lovely planted so they can grow in between other plants. They also self-seed and they have successfully overwintered in my garden to come up year after year so a great investment.

Also, we learnt that the water storage tank in the fire engine can hold up to 2000 litres of water! That's equivalent to 1000 large cartoons of milk! Additionally, we got to operate a hydraulic rescue cutter tool which weighed 16.5kg! Suddenly, a fanfare like alarm rung through the building alerting us all, to our surprise we go to witness the fire fighters performing their procedure to go and put out a Domestic fire. As we learnt the only job of a fire fighter isn't just putting out fires, but it also includes other jobs like the stereotypical idea of getting cats out of trees



and making naan breads! We even got to experience a fire fighter going down the fire pole as they would in the case of a real fire. Overall, we had a wonderful night and completed some of our life saver badge. 1st South Ascot Scout Hut is on Church





### VERGERS AND CLERKS

Here is a story about vergers as told by the Bishop of Stepney, who, after remarking that vergers were amongst the severest critics of sermons, said that one verger congratulated a young curate on his preaching by saying: *"We never knew what sin was, sir, until you came"*. In view of the Bishop's observations we are tempted to question William James Pither (our verger) as to his qualifications for criticising sermons and encouraging young curates. We would also remind him of the generally accepted opinion that vergers are adept at making two cingles. vergers we would not be surprised.

William Day was the last clerk of St Michael and All Angels. He was the village blacksmith who did not stretch his brawny arms *"under the spreading chestnut tree"* simply because the nearest chestnut tree was two miles away. But he did spread his brawny arms when hitting *"boundaries"* on the cricket field and his brawny lungs when leading the responses at church. During the last few months his forge and cottage home have been demolished, Day himself, *"went the way of the flesh"* many years ago, and the scene of his every-day labours

parishioners point of view, and young when he was old as proved by his vigorous chastisement of troublesome juveniles. Ben, in his top-hat and frock coat was a dignified upholder of law and order. As assistant verger he piloted worshippers to their seats; as Beadle he tapped the heads of restless schoolchildren with his long cane. His pay was £5 per year inclusive. On a certain Sunday Ben had an argument with the Vicar – it may have been about the differential calculus or the parking of eight grown-ups in a six-seater pew. Anyhow, Ben lost his temper and – his job!



### A CARPET RIDE TO KHIVA - EXPLORING THE REVIVAL OF 15th CENTURY TIMURID CARPET DESIGNS FROM PERSIAN ILLUMINATED MANUSCRIPTS

### Mr Chris Aslan Alexander

This is a narrative approach to the revival of 15th century carpets in Khiva, a desert oasis in Uzbekistan. Illuminations on vellum – containing the only surviving representations of textiles from this era – flourished, despite the Islamic prohibition on representative art – and are all we had left of Timurid Carpets until Chris Alexander's workshop began to weave them to life again. The lecture will examine the traditional role of carpet weaving and embroidery in the social lives of Central Asian women and how social and political influences led to the decline of textile



production. How do the constraints of gender-inequality, corruption and the sourcing of natural dyes from neighbouring Afghanistan continue to challenge attempts at reviving the rich textile heritage of Khiva, Bukhara and Samarkand?

Chris Aslan was born in Turkey (hence the name Aslan) and spent his childhood there and in war-torn Beirut. After school, Chris spent two years at sea before studying Media and journalism at Leicester University. He then moved to Khiva, a desert oasis in Uzbekistan, establishing a UNESCO

workshop reviving fifteenth century carpet designs and embroideries, and becoming the largest non-government employer in town. He was kicked out as part of an anti-Western purge, and took a year in Cambridge to write A Carpet Ride to Khiva. Chris then spent three years in the Pamirs mountains of Tajikistan, training yak herders to comb their yaks for their cashmere-like down. Next came two years in Kyrgyzstan living in the world's largest natural walnut forest and establishing a wood-carving workshop. Since then, Chris has studied and rowed at Oxford, and is now based in Cambridge and focussed on writing fiction, including Alabaster, Manacle and Mosaic, and The Broken Hexapus. He is currently working on a new book on the Silk Road that marries travel and textiles, and lectures for The Art Society. He also leads tours to Central Asia, returning whenever he can having left a large chunk of his heart out there.


