

I particularly noticed one story that had an eccentric element. We had paused on our motorway journey, failing yet again to charge our car due to the idiosyncrasies of the electric vehicle charging system, when I came across a news item about someone planning

This autumn we can choose to be part of the 'mellow fruitfulness' of the season (Keats) weaving good news into the stories we live out.





#### **POETRY CORNER**

eptember is the time of year when we begin to think of Autumn, nature preparing for Winter, leaves turning, falling, animals preparing for hibernation. It is also of course a time of new beginnings, for the young people in our community, new schools offering new opportunities and experiences. Just as autumn prepares for new beginnings in the Spring. One poem which in the richness of its language describes Autumn in all its beauty and abundance is **To Autumn** by John Keats:

Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness, Close bosom friend of the maturing sun, Conspiring with him how to load and bless, With fruit the vines that round the thatch eves run.

The poem brims with fullness and colour.

Robert Frost, was an American poet, known as the New England poet as he lived there; and many of his poems reflected the area. He was writing up to the time of his death in 1963, and in 1961, read one of his works at the inauguration of John F Kennedy. His poem only Gold can Stay is short but descriptive.

Natures first green is gold, Her hardest hue to hold, Her early leafs a flower. But only so an hour. Then leaf subsides to leaf. So Eden sank to arief. So dawn goes down to day, Nothing gold can stay.

VINCENT VAN GOGH, 1889, WIKIPEDIA Robert Louis Stevenson wrote a poem Autumn Fires, like all his poems it's rhythmic and easy to read.

In the other gardens, And all up the Vale, From the autumn bonfires, See the smoke trail.

And ends: Sing a song of seasons Something bright in all, Flowers in the summer, Fires in the fall!

When writing about our beautiful and wonderful country, and the seasons, I am reminded of one of my American customers from the West Coast. He was fascinated by our weather and seasons as they do not experience the dramatic changes we do. He used to say you could experience four seasons in one day here.

Some autumnal poems compare Autumn to the ageing process in humans. Sonnet 73 by William Shakespeare is one.

When yellow leaves, or none or few do hang, upon those boughs which shake against the cold.

Bare ruined choirs where late the sweet birds sang,

In thou see'st the twilight of each day.

Another American poet Walt Whitman in his poem, wrote:

Give me the splendid, silent sun Give me the juicy, autumnal fruit, Ripe and red from the orchard. Emily Bronte expressed Autumn thus Fall leaves fall, die flowers away. Lengthen night and shorten day, Every leaf speaks bliss to me, Floating from the autumn tree.

To finish two quotes I could not omit; although not from poems. First by George Eliot,

Delicious Autumn, my very soul is wedded to it. And if I were a bird I would fly about the earth seeking the successive autumn's.

And perhaps my favourite from Vincent Van Gogh (opposte):

As long as Autumn lasts. I shall not have hands, canvas and colours enouah. To paint the beautiful things I see.

Now it is possible to get out and about more, enjoy the last days of summer and the beauty of Autumn.

# NEWS FROM THE BEAT YET ANOTHER COURIER FRAUD TO REPORT

HBOUD



he victim of this fraud was called by a 'police officer', who called himself Peter Miller from the Hammersmith Police Station Fraud squad, who also mentioned a DC Burns, from his team.

Peter Miller made multiple calls on the house phone and the victim's wife's mobile. The number was always withheld. He said that the victim's wife had been the victim of a scam and that money had been removed from both their bank accounts. He asked them to check that they still had their debit cards.

The victim checked and said yes, they still had them. Peter Miller told him to put the receiver down, then pick it up again and call his bank, using the security number on the back of the card. The victim did this and really believed he was speaking to his bank. The person he was speaking to confirmed that £16,000 had been taken from their current accounts.

'The bank' said that £10k had been sent to Nigeria and the other £6k had been spent on two separate occasions at shopping centres on luxury items.

'The bank' said that they understood that these transactions were fraudulent and will collect the scammed cards, sending him and his wife new bank cards, by courier.

'Peter Miller' called that afternoon and said that he needed their help with a 'police sting' operation. He asked them to go to their bank and withdraw £4,650.

They went to their bank in Windsor, which correctly went through the Banking Protocol, as this was an unusual withdrawal, refusing to let them withdraw the cash, so they left without the money.

> When they got home, they received another phone call and were told that they were under observation. To prove it, 'Peter Miller' described their surroundings. He told them to go to a

foreign currency exchange in Windsor and withdraw £7,650 in They followed the instructions, wear

euros. They followed the instructions, went and attempted to do this, but again, they were turned away.

They then got a taxi home and have not heard from 'Peter Miller' since. They phoned their bank and were told this was a standard scam and that, thankfully, nothing had been taken from their account.



#### **A VIEW FROM THE GARDEN**

s I write this, we are still waiting for our second heatwave to arrive, it's currently pouring with rain and whilst it's keeping everything very green and growing like topsy, I'm keen for it to stop so I can enjoy sitting in my garden!

Back in March I shared that my lawn was looking very sad and that I had purchased some Evergreen weed control lawn food. Well, I applied it, I scarified the lawn and aerated it and then reseeded the patches where I had removed so much moss! I'm happy to share it has worked, my lawn has never looked better, so I am encouraged to apply an autumn lawn feed!

The vegetable garden has been

producing well, we had a great crop of strawberries, and the broad beans produced a huge crop. I've frozen some for later in the year. The mange tout also cropped heavily, those plants exhausted themselves and I've planted some more seeds. I think I've time to have another crop later in the year. We also harvested 2lbs of gooseberries from one little bush, they were unusually very sweet and made a delicious crumble. BROAD BEANS



Everything had been growing very well, then a deer managed to find its way into the garden. It's happily eaten our runner beans and french beans, the tops of the beetroot and carrots, the lower growing strawberry plants, leaves on the potted fruit trees and some of my roses, cute they may be, but I prefer seeing them in their more natural habitat. We found the sneaky

gap where he got in and it is now blocked up, beans replanted so still waiting for our first crop!

I have lots of clematis in the garden and found they particularly grow well with roses, having a natural support they can wind themselves through, they seem to like each other. I'm sharing two this

> month, one is called Blue Angel and is growing in partial shade. It flowers from June to October and is fully hardy. It's so pretty its soft blue flowers almost look like tissue paper. This is a group 3 clematis. In early spring cut back the previous vear's stems to a pair of strong buds 6-8 inches above ground level and apply a slow-release fertiliser and mulch around the plant. The other is called Sunset

which has velvety crimson flowers with yellow centres. This is a group 2 and should be pruned in late winter or early spring and after the first flush of flowers in early summer. Remove dead or weak stems before growth begins, and then check individual stems from the top down until you reach a healthy pair of buds. Avoid heavy pruning or flowers will be lost. Or leave unpruned and then hard prune them to 1-3 feet from the base every three or four years in late winter.

Last year I started some Echinacea from seed, it starts to flower in it's second year. It's also known as Purple Cone Flower. It's easy to grow and flowers in late summer, bees and butterflies like them, I rushed out to take a photo of a Red Admiral butterfly on this one, but it had flown away before I had chance. You may have come across this used in herbal remedies.

Now is the time to start thinking about spring bulb planting, we have from mid-September to the end of November or before the first frosts to plant them. Early flowering bulbs such as daffodils and crocus are best planted by the end of September. Generally spring flowering bulbs are well suited to a sunny patch in rich, well-draining soil. Why not have a community or street bulb planting day!
