



We have been fortunate this month in obtaining a copy of the Parish Magazine for August 1925 which is reproduced on the cover of this issue. It was found at the bottom of a sewing box that had been inherited by Hazel Bowyer who has lived in the village all her life, and was kept because it announced the marriage of her Aunt Margaret at St Michael's Church on June 27th 1925. (that page of the magazine was reproduced in our August issue). Our grateful thanks to Hazel for unearthing this treasure for us! Which brings me to muse on all



the water that has flowed under Britain's bridge in that span of 95 years. Here's a few that you might recall! Of course, I have missed a few important events out but we don't have the space for everything, and you may well have prioritised other things. Whilst it's not good to dwell on the past too much it is a good place to learn. And maybe to speculate on what might lie ahead. Would dear old Aunt Margaret have even dreamt of the internet, even of TV which was only just around the corner. And having survived the First World War – "the war to end all wars" would she have, in 1925, contemplated the Second? Or the nuclear bomb? Travelling to Spain or the Caribbean for a week's holiday? Would the flu pandemic of 1918 which infected a third of the world's population, have alerted her to the fact that there might be another one in the future with all the medical advances made in the interim?

Whilst we have taken huge strides in technology, we don't seem to have mastered the art of living together without squabbling or grandstanding or trying to force our ideology on others. We seem to be doers rather than be-ers, and whilst doing things is necessary and part of our DNA (only discovered in 1953), we should step back a bit and think more. It might be more convenient for a handful of people to get from London to Birmingham in less than an hour, (excluding the hassle and time involved in getting to and from the termini), but will it make us any happier as a nation? Did High Speed Concorde, which was scrapped after 14 years, make us better people?

THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE

GETTING BACK TO NORMAL?

ike much of the rest of society, over these last few months our two churches have been gradually reopening and tentatively beginning Sunday worship and other activities. We've taken baby steps in this process; produced and revised protocols; and inched our way back to now offering 3 services per Sunday in September (That's our informal, lively, family friendly service at St Michael's 9:15am, our community focused morning worship at

All Souls at 10:30am and at 10:45am, a second service at St Michael's with our traditional, reflective, book of common praver services).

It almost feels like getting back to normal and if you close you eyes or squint a little, deliberately choose to forget the last 5 months, and pretend like you've worn a face covering all your life - you might just kid yourself. For of course, the truth is, our common life whether at church, at work, at school or out and about, is far from being back to normal. It would seem unwise to pretend that it is.


After a couple of months of lockdown we used to hear quite a bit about 'the new normal' as we guessed or imagined what that might be. That phrase is no longer heard as often and I wonder if that's because we know 'normal' isn't here to stay. There may be a few things that remain fairly constant - solid relationships, the natural world (we hope) and our bricks and mortar - but as those who've had to reopen businesses, schools, churches, pubs and playgrounds or just negotiate regular interactions can testify, the guidance shifts, the procedures are tweaked, and just when you think you're steady (and ready for that holiday), something else hits. To help us negotiate change and to manage the ever spinning, topsy turvey world we now live in, I have found great strength in being reminded that God hasn't changed. He really hasn't. He loves us just as he always has. He is there to guide, listen, challenge and help us, just as he always has been. With him there is no need to run from the past for it can be healed and forgiven, likewise there is no need to fear the future for it is safe in his hands and even though church might look or feel different - we proclaim week by week, moment by moment that 'Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, today and forever' (Heb 13:8).

There is a prayer I often use at funeral services which speaks to this theme. I offer it to you

today as a help in the changing tides of this world, and I pray that you may be so aware of God's presence with you that whatever change comes your way you may know His steadfastness love and your security in Him.



spent her early years in Africa and the Far Fast. Sue and two of her sisters attended Our Lady of Peace Convent boarding school in Abingdon.

At the age of 16. she Joined the Thames Valley Police cadets and two years later graduated as a constable, being posted to the Slough Police Area. There, she undertook a number of specialist detective roles including

the Force Drug Team, CID and Domestic Abuse investigation unit. Sue completed her distinguished career as a CID Trainer at The Thames Valley Police Training School.



IN MEMORY

esus said, 'Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted (Matthew 5:4)', but for many of us this has been the strangest time, the most alien and unusual time to grieve. We may have lost loved ones, or watched others go through the grieving process but had to stand at a distance, apart and separate.

During the last 4 months the rules on funerals, who can attend and how, have been changing fairly regularly. As I write this, 16th August, we're allowed up to 30 people in church for a funeral with a much more limited number (close family only) at the graveside. Each crematorium has their own number limits and their own systems, as do the funeral directors. We've all been working closely together as we've navigated the changes and the way we help people grieve.

One of the most poignant funerals for me in this period was my second. At that stage, it was a short service at the graveside only for no more than 6 people, and so we gathered, in the pouring rain, at the corners of the grave. Family members shared some memories. We listened to a hymn, played from someone's phone and as the tears rolled, no one felt allowed to give each other a hug. Distance was maintained, but grief still shared.

Having supported families through these early lockdown deaths (actually very few from Covid-19), the joy of having 30 in a church building was palpable last week. Restrictions on singing notwithstanding, there was joy in the air as we listened to music of hope and love, heard memories of a life well lived and stories of faith for the future.

Every funeral is different, every circumstance and life unique, but in the

magazine we wanted to pay tribute to those who have died during this pandemic, of whatever cause. This list below are those we know about, but you may also have people you are remembering – please add them in your mind to the list below.

And as you remember, and as you grieve, remember those words of Jesus:

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted."

May you know his comfort and his peace in your heart and soul today.



It is common that when an animal is purchased in the way described above it becomes seriously ill within weeks of purchase which in some cases proves fatal heart failure or diseases such as parvovirus have been reported.

In April 2020 Lucy's Law came in to force in order to ban third party or 'middle-man' sellers. This law means that all puppies and kittens under six months must now be bought direct from the breeder, or from a reputable rescue organisation. Licensed dog

breeders are required to show puppies interacting with their mothers in their place of birth. If a business sells puppies or kittens without a licence, they could receive an unlimited fine or be sent to prison for up to six months.

The law is named after Lucy, a Cavalier King Charles Spaniel who was rescued from a puppy farm where she was subjected to terrible conditions. Lucy became the symbol and mascot of anti-puppy-farm

campaigning. She died in December 2016, and Lucy's Law is named in her honour. Campaigners and charities fed into work by an all-party group of MPs called "APDAWG" to make these important legal changes. Unfortunately, this is not the end as we are also continuing to see the illegal importation of animals from abroad. Unscrupulous dealers are bringing in very young animals, often without the correct vaccinations, such as rabies; with missing or forged pet passports. These animals have been separated from their mothers before they are ready and are made to travel long distances, so likely to develop major health problems at a later date.

TOP TIPS

• Always consider using a registered charity to rescue a pet and give them a new home.

• Research the breeder online. Be very wary if they are advertising many litters of different breeds. Copy and paste the seller's phone number into a search engine. If the number is being used on lots of different

adverts, on various sites, this is another red flag. • Remember that puppies and kittens

should never be sold under eight weeks old (for imported animals this will be at least 15 weeks).

• Ask the breeder lots of questions, visit the

• Keep payments recorded and traceable.

• Ask to see the pup with the mum and watch the interaction with the litter.

• Never pay cash and if anything concerns you then don't hand over any money or buy the pet, walk away and contact Trading



SCAMS & FRAUDS

Since the Pandemic, scams and frauds have been increasing, as more people are based at home:

Scam letters are arriving from China – they say – someone with a name similar to yours has died, leaving a large amount of money and you, may be entitled to a share of the estate. The letter goes on to request that the recipient email the letter sender, with their full personal details including bank account details, for a transfer of the money - If you get one these - BIN IT!

The old - 'I am crying as I write this message as I have been robbed and have no money to pay for my hotel, or to get home'; ... is back, as people start to travel. In one case, a friend received a 'Snapchat' message from someone they knew well saying the above, so they sent them £80. They then got another message, asking for



an additional £200! They then became suspicious and made some enquiries. Their friend's computer had been hacked and this message had been sent to everyone, in their personal address book ! If you get one of these - BIN IT!

Phone calls - the old Windows / Microsoft / BT scam - 'Your computer is running slowly / been hacked and may have malware'. In one case they called twice due to connection problems, once it was a man and on the second occasion, a woman. ANYTHING LIKE THIS - JUST PUT THE PHONE DOWN.

If anyone phones you trying to sell high interest investments accounts / sure fire deal on shares - PUT THE PHONE DOWN

As an organisation, Thames Valley Farmers' Market Co-operative has a traditional farmers' market ethos, with sustainability and traceability of produce at the core of our business. We provide a platform to help farmers and a wide variety of producers present their wares for sale directly to customers, and for up to 100 selected members our markets are their shopfronts and a place to sell what they grow, rear, process and create themselves.
